#### The Parish Spotlight ~ Alpha

In 2014, at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Plymouth, Michigan, my wife Kristin and I first heard about Alpha. I don't remember any specifics other than how life-changing it was, and that the parish was making it a priority above all other programs. Kristin and I were just two of 12,000 members at the parish, and we wanted to try something out of our comfort zone and hopefully meet some new people. We are both "cradle Catholics," essentially meaning that we grew up in the church. Catholicism was not something we pondered or challenged. It was handed down to us by our families. We "went to church" every Sunday, I was an altar boy growing up and served as a Eucharistic minister in college at Penn State, and Kristin was even more obedient in her Catholic upbringing. She had just finished medical school, where she was president of their active campus Catholic group. I thought we were pretty good Catholics, and we would be raising our future children to be Catholic. Looking back now, I would say I was operating on a faith that had maxed out at a 6<sup>th</sup> grade Sunday School maturity level. I didn't spend my time thinking about what it truly meant to be a Christian, what role Jesus Christ had in my life, what made the Catholic church unique or true, or whether my faith in God needed to be shared with others.

Kristin and I ultimately took the leap to try Alpha. We nervously attended the first session, not knowing what to expect. We were the young couple at the table, surrounded by smiling strangers. We had dinner to break the initial awkwardness, watched a good recorded talk that raised questions about our purpose in life, and finished with some simple icebreakers. We quickly realized this was something different than we had ever experienced. Each week my eyes were opened more to an awareness of how little attention I was giving to my faith prior to Alpha. It was like I was learning the building blocks of Christianity for the first time. God was bursting into our lives. Kristin and I would leave each week with so much to talk about. We were growing together in our newfound interest in knowing Jesus, and we were gaining lifelong friends at our table in the process. After eleven weeks of Alpha sessions, a powerful Saturday retreat focusing on the Holy Spirit, and a final celebration dinner, we were changed.

Alpha ultimately opened us up to having a personal relationship with Christ. It also put us on a path to learn more about our Catholic faith and formed a desire to share this experience with others. Above everything else, we realize that life can offer wealth, pleasure, power, and honor in many ways, but that pleasure cannot compete with the love and joy of knowing Jesus. This joy is life changing and life saving. We see people hurting all around us. On the surface, they seem happy, but underneath everyone has a story. We're all struggling with something that puts a hole inside us. No new job or car or award or sum of money can seem to fill that hole. As one Catholic author puts it, that is a "God-sized hole." Only he can personalize your journey to fill that hole with his love so that it spills over and bursts forth to be given to others. Alpha kick-started that journey for Kristin and I, and we hope to offer that experience to our parishes starting this year. Come and see. Try Alpha!
