From the Pastor's Desk

I was recently praying with someone over the phone. A phrase came into my mind as I prayed, "what the enemy intends for evil, God will use for good." Who is the enemy? The world, the flesh, and the devil are the enemy. The world refers to the tendency for us to believe that the affairs of life are all that is important, and that we do not have a spiritual life. The flesh are the desires that make us selfish – our only goal in life is to gratify our passions. The flesh leaves no room for love. The devil of course is the fallen angel and all those who follow him.

Certainly, the virus and all the related suffering that has been caused by it are not from God. God does not cause suffering. But God will use suffering for a good end. What the enemy intends for evil, God will use for good! The foremost example of this is the Paschal Mystery. God sent His Son into the world, knowing that we would crucify Him. The Lord used that evil and turned it into an offering which took away our sins. The Cross sets us free from slavery to sin, and gives us the opportunity to live a Resurrected life. Instead of being a puppet on a string, we are free to choose joy, peace, purpose, and life. We can have hope for heaven and for the rising of our bodies on the last day.

This time seems like the hour of darkness itself. There exists already so much confusion and woundedness in our families and communities. Now, on top of that, we have a health emergency and financial hardship. We are carrying the cross of fear, anxiety, and isolation behind closed doors. But we also remember that the apostles were huddled behind closed doors on Easter Sunday when Jesus walked through the door and said, "peace be with you." Just as then, so now Jesus will bring us peace. We may feel that we do not have much to offer at this point. But Jesus will take what we have to give to Him and make it grow, as He did for that one little boy with the loaves and fishes. God is still God and is worthy of our trust. He is capable of pointing this tragedy to a happy ending.
