Parish Spotlight ~ From the Pastor's desk

February gives us interesting celebrations. February 2nd is Groundhog Day, of course. You do know that Punxsutawney is the most famous location in the Diocese of Erie? It is much more widely known than Erie or any other town in our diocese. Actually, it is not the only place in the world where handlers produce an animal to predict the weather. In many places in America and Europe, similar celebrations are held on or around February 2nd. Why that date? It is the date of the Presentation of the Lord. You remember that this is the event where Joseph and Mary brought the infant Christ to the Temple to be circumcised. There, they encountered the holy old ones, Simeon and Anna. This feast is liturgically represented by candles, as Jesus is the light that has come into this world.

Traditionally, February 2nd was the feast where candles were blessed for usage throughout the year. Hence, February 2nd has also been referred to in some places as "Candlemas" Day. The 2nd of February is also roughly the midpoint of winter. It is natural then, to have a celebration that focuses on the return of the light into this world. All the rituals of animals predicting the remaining course of winter are an outgrowth of the Catholic celebration of Candlemas Day, February 2nd.

Also on February 3rd, we have the blessing of the throats on the Feast of St. Blaise. This stems from the tradition that St. Blaise helped to remove a fishbone from someone's throat, thereby saving their life. Also, Blaise was said to have had two candles brought to him while in prison to brighten his cell. Hence, the tradition of blessing throats with candles was born, and continues even to this day. St. Blaise's imprisonment would end with a gruesome martyrdom at the hands of the local authorities. May he pray for us.

If your loved one is in another nursing home, please call the parish in the town that that home is located, and ask the pastor for guidance. Fr. Ed Walk is the chaplain at the Dubois hospital, and can make visitation freely throughout the hospital. The hospital has informed me that it may be possible now for me to visit parishioners at the hospital, but only if the nursing staff deems it a situation serious enough to necessitate a visit. <u>SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION</u> - The obligation to attend these Masses is not in effect. No one is required to attend mass in person at this time.

<u>CONFESSIONS-</u> Confessions will be available at Assumption after Saturday 4:30 Mass and Sunday 10:30 Mass at St. Mary's, and at Assumption after Tuesday and Wednesday 5 p.m. masses. Please note that Confessions will not be available before any Mass. Masks are required for Confession. Confessional at St. Mary's is in altar server sacristy, at Assumption, confession is the Parishioner's Aid room.

FUNERALS AND WEDDINGS - Please note that you are allowed to have non-family and extended family attend funerals and weddings again. The seating capacity for Assumption Church given social distancing is 60. The capacity for St. Mary's is 85. There is overflow seating with the closed circuit tv in the St. Mary's Social Hall for an additional 40-60 people. We are working on installing a closed circuit tv at Assumption Social Hall that will seat an additional 30 people. All attendees at funerals and weddings, except for bride and groom and those "in the wedding" must wear masks for the duration of the service.
