From the Pastor's Desk—Remembering Marie Dorwarth

On Saturday, August 21st, Marie Dorwarth passed away. If you are a long-time parishioner of St. Mary's Parish, Reynoldsville, you may remember Marie. Marie lived out her adult life in a modest home along Route 322, near the Prescottville-Big Run Road intersection. You may have noticed a house along that way that used to have a pro-life yard sign in the front yard – that was Marie's house. Marie had to move from her house in recent months as the property was sold for the building of the new Dollar General store.

Marie was the long-time cook and cleaner for St. Mary's Parish. I do not know if her whole tenure as cook and cleaner was under Monsignor Mingot, but much of it was. In fact, I don't know all the stories that you may have shared with Marie. I do know that she was very devoted to the parish. She loved St. Mary's very much. She was at most events at the parish, whether in the social hall or the church. Much of her recent years were lived out at home with her cats, all preceding her in death, except for one. She told me that she acquired the cats when someone dropped off a litter of kittens at the back door of St. Mary's Church.

Whether or not you knew Marie, and whether or not you are a member of St. Mary's Parish, if you have been around the church for a while you know it is people like Marie who make a parish work. Marie donated most of time and work, I would imagine. She was exceptionally devoted to the Catholic faith, to the sacraments, and to the Rosary. She attended Mass frequently. Often, when I would visit her house, she would have EWTN Catholic TV on in the background. She would often remark, "well, I don't know why I'm still here, but I am". She knew that God was going to keep her here as long as He wanted. Well, that day finally came. May she rest in peace. She's in a better place.

Many thanks to Earl and Dee Lingenfelter, who took care of Marie for many years, and were her good friends.
