The Parish Spotlight ~ Christmas Traditions

Now that Advent has ended, and our time of preparation is over, it's time to relax and enjoy the blessings of Christmas. It is time for family get togethers, making new memories and remembering our loved ones who started or shared our family Christmas traditions.

Father Bill Barron shared his special memories of his family's traditions. Their Christmas celebration began at his home parish of St. Andrew's in Erie, where they would attend the earliest Mass on Christmas Eve together. Following Mass, they would go to his Mom's parents' home for a traditional meal of Grandma's Lasagna and gift exchange. On Christmas morning, they would open gifts from under their own Christmas tree and prepare for dinners later that afternoon. The first dinner was at Mom's parents' home and later in the day they would go to Dad's parents' home for the second dinner of the day. As his grandparents got older the locations changed, but the traditions remained the same. Now, his Mom holds the Christmas Eve celebrations at their home and his cousin Jessica now prepares Christmas dinner at her home. During the time between Christmas and New Year's Eve, the celebration continues by visiting extended family members. On New Year's Eve they attend Mass, followed by dinner and staying up until midnight to ring in the New Year. No Barron Family Christmas is complete without first visiting the local tree farm and cut down their Christmas tree that is decorated and remains up until the Liturgical Christmas season has ended.

Elaine Fike shared her family's Christmas traditions that she now holds in her home. On Christmas Eve, she hosts 20-25 people for Grandma Manco's traditional Christmas Eve feast of seven fishes, they eat seven things for good luck. For the entire day no meat is eaten. Their dinner consists of several types of hand breaded fish, white spaghetti, chick peas, fontina cheese and savoy cabbage. Dinner is served to the men first at the dinner table, then the children, and finally the women, who customarily eat in the kitchen. On Christmas Day they get together again for another traditional meal of spaghetti and meatballs, Italian wedding soup and baked chicken. Not only did the celebrations move to Elaine's home, but also her Grandma Manco's dishes that she only used for Christmas Eve dinner, are now with Elaine as well.

Our family began the Christmas season with a German tradition of writing letters to St. Nicholas and leaving them in your boot on the door step the night before the feast day of St. Nicholas on December 6th, if you were good, he left some sweet treats in your boot. On Christmas Eve we have the Carlson family get together, where we share a meal and exchange gifts. On Christmas morning we go to Christmas morning Mass together to celebrate the birth of Jesus and then come home to open presents. Christmas dinner at the Simbeck home was in the afternoon, with gifts exchanged and a time for games and sharing stories of Christmases gone by. Christmas dinner has been moved to our home this year and those same traditions were celebrated.

I hope you enjoyed a glimpse into our family traditions. Blessings for a Happy and Healthy New Year!
