The Parish Spotlight ~ Respect Life Sunday ~ Fr. Bill Barron

The March for Life Rally held in Washington DC every year in January, to protest the acts of abortion and euthanasia. The reason that is held in January is because it is the anniversary of Roe vs. Wade, a landmark decision issued January 22, 1973, by the United States Supreme Court decriminalizing the act of abortion.

The very first March for Life was held on January 22, 1974, and was organized by Nellie Gray, a Pro-Life activist and a Roman Catholic. Fearing that January 22 would come and go with no recognition by the public, Nellie and a group of pro-life advocates gathered at her home in Washington to discuss ways to commemorate the anniversary of Roe v. Wade and the thousands of lives lost that year. In hopes that the decision would soon be overturned, they organized a one-time march around the U.S. Capitol, which drew an estimated 20,000 people. When it was clear that Roe v. Wade was not going to be easily overturned, the March for Life was incorporated as a non-profit, non-sectarian organization, committed to the "Life Principles" (marchforlife.org).

In speaking with Father Bill Barron, who has been participating in the March for Life Rally since high school, wanted us to know that there is a "misconception that the March for Life Rally is only for middle to older generations. The March for Life Rally is really compromised of high school and college aged people." According to Father Bill there are "tens of thousands of high schoolers and college age students." Father Bill also shares that the younger generation are "living their faith by sight." It is encouraging to see that these high school and college age students are standing up for their faith and for what they believe as Catholics.

Father Bill adds that he appreciates those who are participating in the Life Chain that takes place on Sunday, October 7, 2:30-3:30pm at the DuBois City Park, they are great witnesses for our faith. Life Chain is a peaceful and prayerful public witness of pro-life individuals standing for 90 minutes praying for our nation and for an end to abortion. It is a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community.
