The Parish Spotlight ~ Stewardship—Reflect, Respond, Renew!

St. Mary's and Assumption Parishes share the message of God's mercy with the larger community. We accomplish this through our collective prayer and collective action. Next week, we will make a financial pledge, a sacrificial giving pledge. The theme of this year's pledge is "stewardship: reflect, respond, renew!" It has been a while since we all reflected on what has been done by St. Mary's Parish for Reynoldsville and Assumption Parish for Sykesville. I am proud to be your pastor, and to be associated with the people who I work with, and with you all. Today, I want to pause for a moment to say thank you for what you do.

We have people who are devoted secretaries and wear multiple hats besides. We have a long time devoted Religious Education director and a dedicated group of catechists. We have maintenance workers and volunteers that do an excellent job preserving the building and saving our parishes a lot of money. We have a group of accomplished musicians and singers at both churches, along with our lectors, servers, ushers, and Eucharistic ministers. We have parishioners who take communion to the homebound each weekend of the year. We have the Knights of Columbus, the Catholic Daughters, and Altar Rosary Societies for both parishes who donate time to parish support and charity. We have the board members that take care of our parish cemeteries. We have volunteers that run our yearly calendar of parish fundraisers – we have volunteers that staff St. Mary's Bingo every Sunday night. We have paid staff and volunteers who clean the buildings. We have people who mow the grass and keep the grounds.

There is much that is done on a daily basis that many of you do not see. There is a lot that happens in support of families struggling with various challenges. There is much to do in preparing young people for sacraments – for preparing people for marriage. A good amount of counseling and spiritual direction goes on, too. Always, there is the need to mend fences, to reconcile hurting people – this takes time and patience. A lot of liturgical practice and preparation takes place. Funerals require a lot of people to drop whatever they are doing to serve, and they do just that. I try to spend as much time in confession, visiting the homebound, and those in the nursing home, as my schedule allows. And yes, there is a lot of secretarial stuff, too-record keeping – report filing – basic communication through website, phone, bulletin mail.

We are taking an intentional time out this fall to reflect on your financial support of your parish. If we think about what we are doing from time to time, we will undoubtedly do it better. While we can't re-examine our habits all the time, we can do so at least occasionally, and that is what I will be asking you to do next week.

All parishioners of both parishes will receive a mailing this week. It will include a brochure explaining the pledge process and a pledge card. Please bring your pledge card in the envelope provided back to church next weekend and drop in the basket. You may also mail them to the parish office. It will save the parish money for everyone to return a pledge card, even if you are unable to make a commitment this year. If you are in a position to increase your giving, please do. Even if you can increase a few dollars a month, that is of great help to the mission of the parish. Many are on fixed incomes, especially our elderly – this is not a forced extraction of money from you – a demand that has been made by some priests in the past. Truly, if you are not in a position to increase your giving, keep it at the same level. And even if you need to decrease your giving, its ok. Ultimately its between God and you to decide.

Pray about and reflect on your financial stewardship pledge this week. God blesses us when we give to Him! Some of you know my regard for Mr. Rogers. He once said, "The important thing for us is to look for what's fine in everybody – and that will help us to want to take care of everybody." Look for what is fine here! Are our parishes perfect, staffed with perfect people, and a perfect pastor? You support rather imperfect people, but who are you really giving to? It's God. When you support the good things God is doing here, you will find it will renew your heart personally. And isn't this what we all want, a heart made new? We all need that. Let us begin that journey of renewal together.
