The Parish Spotlight ~ Being Catholic in College ~ Autumn Carlson

College is a time for learning, and not just in class. For most students, the first challenge is getting used to being away from your parents and making your own decisions. Having been in a state college system myself, it's sometimes difficult to uphold your beliefs while being in classes that are pushing more liberal ways of thinking.

That's where the Newman Society became a place of refuge. The Newman Society was founded by Catholic laypeople in 1993, with the purpose to promote and defend Catholic education. In Lock Haven, the Newman house was an off-campus place Catholic students could go to study, as well as commune with fellow Catholics. Every Wednesday evening, students could come to the Newman house to eat dinner and have a bible study afterwards. One of the local Catholic churches has a student Mass at 5pm on Sundays, where students can actively participate as lectors, Eucharist ministers, and altar servers.

By having access to the Newman Society, it is easier for Catholic college students to continue to practice their faith with others who have the same beliefs. One of the friends I met through the Newman Society, Andrew (pictured on the cover) is currently studying at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia, having been encouraged by his family and friends to follow the call to the priesthood.

College is about growth, in knowledge, in social life, and in faith. While being a Catholic in college can be challenging, the Newman Society helps students to keep growing in their faith, and even encourages them to remain active in the church.
