The Parish Spotlight ~ Fr. Bill Barron, Holy Land and Rome Pilgrimage



While talking with Fr. Bill Barron, I learned some interesting facts. In his daily prayer life, he immerses himself in scripture. As you know, our Mass is filled with scripture passages from both the Old and New Testament. He prays the Divine Office several times a day, consults the Bible when preparing his homilies and in his daily reflections. He has also certainly seen his share of the world. Did you know that he has attended 3 World Youth Days? In Rome, Italy; Toronto, Canada; and Sydney, Australia (which included a layover in Singapore). He has also traveled to France, Austria, and Germany to name a few. So, when contacted by Tekton Ministries, a Catholic Pilgrimage Company, to lead a pilgrimage, it was only fitting that he chose the Holy Land and Rome.

It is easy to see the excitement when he mentions specific places he is looking forward to visiting. When I asked what he was most looking forward to, he responds, "The Via Dolorosa – the Way of the Cross," he wants to see it with his own eyes and walk along with his own feet, and "The Sea of Galilee, because that is where Jesus walked on water." This pilgrimage will bring the Gospel to life! Along with Father Marc Solomon, he and the pilgrims will walk where Jesus and his Disciples walked. Thankfully we will be traveling as modern Disciples – airplanes and buses while walking along the way.

We will renew our Baptismal vows in the Jordan River, where Jesus was Baptized. We will visit places we hear about in the Gospel such as the Church of the Nativity, the Upper Room, the Mount of Beatitudes, the Mount of Olives (Palm Sunday Road), the Garden of Gethsemane, and finally, the Via Dolorosa where we will pray the Stations of the Cross and finish our Holy Land journey at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher which contains the sites of Jesus' crucifixion, death, tomb, and resurrection. The arrangements are made to have daily Mass and an opportunity for Confession along the journey at locations such as the Church of the Annunciation in Nazareth, the Mount of the Beatitudes after crossing the Sea of Galilee in a boat, the Nativity Church in Bethlehem, the Church of All Nations, Jerusalem, and the Church of St. Anne as we enter Old City Jerusalem. From here we fly onto Rome for the last days of our journey to participate in the Wednesday audience with Pope Francis, take in the beautiful sights at the Vatican Museum and St. Peter's Basilica.
