

#### Parish Spotlight ~ From the Pastor's Desk

During this Lent, I have been going on about humility. A few years' back, I was introduced to the Litany of Humility. It's a tough prayer to pray if you really mean what you're saying. I think that the last line of the prayer really helps one to understand the meaning of the prayer – that others may become more holy than I, provided that I become as holy as I should. It is hard to entrust one's life to God when God allows some horrendous suffering to come into our lives. We might rather believe the messages of Hollywood and Madison Avenue which convince us that we really can have it all, minus any suffering. But, alas, life is hard. We cannot run from the Cross. Look at our neighbors who try to run from pain with alcohol, drugs, pornography, gangster activity, petty crime, etc. These aren't happy people. They sprint away from pain and death, but in the end, they will be overtaken by them.

No, true peace only comes when we can find someone who can bring us peace both in good times and bad. Only the Lord Jesus can do that because He shares in our pain on the Cross, and promises the hope of Resurrection. God won't save us from experiences of suffering, but God has redeemed our suffering. In fact, it is through suffering that we learn the most about God, even more so than in the good times (and there are more good times than bad with God).

It would be good if we all faced our pride, and our drive to save ourselves, and realize that we need a savior. I understand that this is not the way that the world works, but we are called as Christians to be in the world, not of the world. There is a big difference. It's tough to be in relationships, but love gives us the power to do it. May we pray that we can be better lovers of God, ourselves, and our neighbor. Love is what makes living worthwhile. Being humble opens the door to love, even if that love is not returned as we would hope it would be by another. God will always return our love, and that is why God is worthy of our love, and our trust.
