

Parish Spotlight ~ From the Pastor's Desk

Advent is a wonderful season. It is a season of hope! It is appropriate that we have as a focal point for Advent the candles of the wreath. Advent is in the darkest time of the year. Yet, it is in the darkness that the light shines most brightly. The candles of the wreath stand out in stark contrast to the darkness around it. This is the way that Christians ought to be – light in a dark world. In these days, there is a lot of darkness. It has been in many ways a very depressing year, 2020. Yet, bad times cannot last forever. Better days are ahead. I sense we still have quite a ways to go before we see those better days, but they will come. We need to light a hopeful candle in vigil and wait for the coming of our Messiah.

The Christmas Mass schedule is listed in today's bulletin. The Christmas Eve schedule will be a bit hectic for myself and the other liturgical ministers. I added another early Mass to the schedule for Christmas Eve because I think that is the time that most people will want to come to church. Also, we very likely will not have enough seats for everyone if I only celebrate one Christmas Eve Mass at St. Mary's. Keep in mind that the maximum occupancy for any given Mass at St. Mary's is 140 (using the closed circuit TV system in the social room for overflow) and 100 at Assumption (also using the new closed circuit TV system in the social room). Seating will be first come, first seated. There is a fair chance that you may have to sit in the social hall for the mass, especially if you come right before the start of the Mass. It will be best if you show up earlier than usual. Of course, there is the chance that no one will show up for the Christmas Mass because of COVID! We will be prepared for all possibilities.

2020 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL COMING TO A CLOSE: Each parish is assessed a certain fundraising goal by the Erie Diocese in support of the annual Catholic Services Appeal. NEW YEAR'S DAY MASS SCHEDULE: Thursday, December 31st @ St. Mary's Church - 4:30 p.m. Friday, January 1st @ Assumption Church - 9 a.m.

<u>FUNERAL DINNERS:</u> Effective immediately, the social halls of both Assumption Parish and St. Mary's Parish will be open for funeral dinners after funerals at the respective churches. Please note, however, that the Altar Rosary Societies of both parishes are predominantly made up of people who are the "at risk" part of the population for serious complications from the Coronavirus. Therefore, if you wish to use either social hall for a dinner after a funeral mass, you must provide for your own caterer. We cannot at this time expect the Rosary Society to facilitate your funeral dinner. Whenever that would change, I will let you know. Fr. Bill Barron

HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES: Visitation to the Nursing Homes is still limited to clergy assigned to the home. If you have a family member who needs to be visited at Christ the King Manor, please contact Fr. Matias at the Manor. He will be happy to visit and if necessary, provide the sacraments. If your loved one is in another nursing home, please call the parish in the town that that home is located, and ask the pastor for guidance. Fr. Ed Walk is the chaplain at the Dubois hospital, and can make visitation freely throughout the hospital. The hospital has informed me that it may be possible now for me to visit parishioners at the hospital, but only if the nursing staff deems it a situation serious enough to necessitate a visit. SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION - The obligation to attend these Masses is not in effect. No one is required to attend mass in person at this time.

<u>CONFESSIONS-</u> Confessions will be available at St. Mary's after Saturday 4:30 Mass and Sunday 10:30 Mass, and at Assumption after Tuesday and Wednesday 5 p.m. masses. Please note that Confessions will not be available before any Mass. Masks are required for Confession. Confessional at St. Mary's is in altar server sacristy, at Assumption, confession is the altar servers' room.

<u>FUNERALS AND WEDDINGS</u> - Please note that you are allowed to have non-family and extended family attend funerals and weddings again. The seating capacity for Assumption Church given social distancing is 60. The capacity for St. Mary's is 85. There is overflow seating with the closed circuit tv in the St. Mary's Social Hall for an additional 40-60 people. We are working on installing a closed circuit tv at Assumption Social Hall that will seat an additional 30 people. All attendees at funerals and weddings, except for bride and groom and those "in the wedding" must wear masks for the duration of the service.

BAPTISMS can proceed freely. Please call to schedule a baptism anytime.
