The Parish Spotlight ~ Third Week of Advent

Life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss it. With just a little more than a week away from Christmas, stop and look around? There's no time for that! EMERGENCY PARKING: Emergency Parking has been added in front of St Mary's Church on Main Street. The reason is that first responders need a place to park that will not cause them to block Route 322. We also want State Police to periodically park in front the church during mass as a deterrent. What this means is that when you come to Mass, please do not park in the emergency parking space. Its purpose is for Saturday/Sunday Mass, and not as much through the week. Thanks. Fr. Bill

INSURANCE FEE FOR SOCIAL HALL USAGE - The Diocese of Erie is enforcing a policy that requires private parties who want to use parish social halls to purchase liability insurance for one time use. The cost is \$81 for up to 100 participants, and \$98 for 100-500 participants. An option is also offered to obtain a "Certificate of Insurance" from your own insurance company, naming the Bishop of Erie, Diocese of Erie, and the parish as additional insureds. The amount of coverage listed on the certificate must also be at least \$1,000,000. The letter from the Diocese will be provided to any party who wishes to use St. Mary's or Assumption's social halls before booking. Please continue to use the normal procedures in place for booking both halls. Payment will be collected by the parish office at the time of booking. The parish office will make application for the event insurance on behalf of the party. Please note that this does not apply to parish functions (for example, funeral dinners, bingo, parish societies, religious education), but only private parties using the hall.
