The Parish Spotlight ~ St. Mary's Cemetery Update

Bingo: Sunday at 6:00pm at St. Mary

As you may have noticed, the St. Mary's Cemetery Board has been very active recently. They are working hard to provide a beautiful and dignified resting place for our loved ones and forebearers. Just recently, the final posts along the roadside have been installed to protect the graves from impact by motor vehicles. Now, the board is implementing new rules and regulations for the cemetery. As far as they can tell, this is the first set of regulations ever written down for St. Mary's Cemetery. All plot owners whose contact information the cemetery office has will be receiving a copy of the regulations in the mail. Some copies will be provided in the back of St. Mary's and Assumption churches. These regulations will be posted on the parish website www.stmarysassumption.com

To achieve the goal of providing a beautiful and dignified resting place for our loved ones, it is essential that the cemetery be maintained. This must be done in a way that is cost effective and simple, especially for those who mow. I want to highlight a few of the most relevant rules regarding plot care and monument erection.

IF YOU MUST TAKE ACTION TO BRING YOUR GRAVE LOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH THESE NEW RULES, YOU MUST DO SO BY THE **END OF OCTOBER.** IF YOU DO NOT, PLEASE BE AWARE THAT CEMETERY MANAGEMENT WILL BRING YOUR GRAVE LOT INTO COMPLIANCE. No other decorations of the grave aside from the following are permitted on a grave plot and they will be removed if left by the lot owner after the end of October. Monument=grave headstone.

- Only statues affixed to the monument or sitting on the monument base will be permitted.
- Urns are permitted must be placed on or in front of a monument.

- If vigil lights or solar lights are used, they must be placed immediately next to the base of the monument to avoid problems with regular maintenance. Only one said light (vigil or solar) per grave will be permitted.
- If a shepherd's hook or similar decoration are used, they must be placed immediately next to the base. Only one said decoration per grave will be permitted.
- Annual flowers are permitted in front of the grave only. Care and up-keep are the responsibility of the planter. Trimming of graves with planted flowers will be the responsibility of the owner. All other planting and digging- including shrubs are not permitted.
- Spring clean up of lots must be completed by the first week of April. Fall clean up of lots must be completed by the last week of October.
- All Memorial Dealers must present a drawing or rubbing of any proposed monument to the cemetery office. They must also contact the cemetery office before installing, repairing, or altering any markers.

If you have any questions about interpretation of these rules, you may call me at the parish office to set up an appointment to discuss. The members of the cemetery board are Sam Zaffuto, Betsy Stover, Barb Murray, and Bill Havrilla. They are appointed by the pastor of St. Mary's Parish.
