



#### Parish Spotlight ~ From the Pastor's Desk

I will be hosting a book study on Dr. Ralph Martin's new book "A Church in Crisis: Pathways Forward. The book explores theological problems within the church and puts forward a solution of faithfulness to God's Holy Scriptures and openness to the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives. The study will be run via Zoom video conferencing only. So, to join the study, you would need to sign up for Zoom. Also, to sign up, you will need to call or e-mail the parish office, or sign up on the sheet in the back of both the churches. You are certainly welcome to buy your own book, but you may want to buy one through our church account to save 25% on the book price and save shipping costs. The study will extend for 10 weeks, on Monday evenings from 7-8 p.m, starting on February 22<sup>nd</sup> and ending on April 26. The study will also include a q and a with Dr. Martin on April 12<sup>th</sup>. Deadline to sign up will be on Monday, Feb. 15<sup>th</sup>.

Some parishioners have received letters in the mail in recent days and there is confusion as to why they received them. Thank you, Dave, for your commitment to making our facilities a clean and welcoming place, especially during this last year of COVID. <u>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u>: St. Mary's Religious Education Program will be returning to in person religious education classes on Sunday, Feb. 21st. Sessions are from 9:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.

<u>BINGO</u>: St. Mary's Bingo will continue to be cancelled for the month of February. We are seriously considering a return of Bingo for the month of March and ongoing from there, but that is dependent on the number of COVID cases continuing to decline in the area. Fr. Barron

<u>REGISTRATION</u> for new students of DuBois Central Catholic, grades preschool through 5 for the school year 2021-2022 will begin on Monday, February 1<sup>st</sup>. Tuition assistance applications are also available. Please call the school at 371-2570 or stop in the elementary office for forms.,

<u>HOLY TRIDUUM 2021:</u> We will observe the regular order for the sharing of the Triduum services between St. Mary's and Assumption. This means that, in 2021, it will be St. Mary's turn to host Holy Thursday Mass and the Easter Vigil, and Assumption's turn to host Good Friday services.

<u>FUNERAL DINNERS:</u> Effective immediately, the social halls of both Assumption Parish and St. Mary's Parish will be open for funeral dinners after funerals at the respective churches. Please note, however, that the Altar Rosary Societies of both parishes are predominantly made up of people who are the "at risk" part of the population for serious complications from the Coronavirus. Therefore, if you wish to use either social hall for a dinner after a funeral mass, you must provide for your own caterer. We cannot at this time expect the Rosary Society to facilitate your funeral dinner. Whenever that would change, I will let you know. Fr. Bill Barron

HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES: Visitation to the Nursing Homes is still limited to clergy assigned to the home. If you have a family member who needs to be visited at Christ the King Manor, please contact Fr. Matias at the Manor. He will be happy to visit and if necessary, provide the sacraments. If your loved one is in another nursing home, please call the parish in the town that that home is located, and ask the pastor for guidance. Fr. Ed Walk is the chaplain at the Dubois hospital, and can make visitation freely throughout the hospital. The hospital has informed me that it may be possible now for me to visit parishioners at the hospital, but only if the nursing staff deems it a situation serious enough to necessitate a visit. <u>FUNERALS AND WEDDINGS</u> - Please note that you are allowed to have non-family and extended family attend funerals and weddings again. The seating capacity for Assumption Church given social distancing is 60. The capacity for St. Mary's is 85. There is overflow seating with the closed circuit tv in the St. Mary's Social Hall for an additional 40-60 people. We are working on installing a closed circuit tv at Assumption Social Hall that will seat an additional 30 people. All attendees at funerals and weddings, except for bride and groom and those "in the wedding" must wear masks for the duration of the service.
