# The Parish Spotlight ~ Debbie Barliar ~ Saturday Night Music Ministry

"Eat this bread, drink this cup, come to Him and never be hungry." Like the Eucharist fills the soul of millions of Catholics every Sunday, music within the Church fills the ears, minds, and hearts of those in attendance.

Debbie stated that even if people weren't singing along, she would hear comments about the words and how they affected each person individually. She has also noticed how music has made an impact on people, and how the words even reach out to people who are not Catholic, allowing them to listen when they would not before. Music brings together the members of the Church in a beautiful, unreplaceable way that cannot be seen, only heard.

"Eat this bread, drink this cup, trust in Him and you will not thirst." If you find your-self humming or singing along to this hymn, "Eat This Bread," Debbie's favorite hymn, then the music within the Church has influenced you as well. Use the voice God blessed you with, on or off key, and sing along with the hymns to find a deeper meaning of the words within the Mass.
