## JUST SAYING -

Some thoughts on today's scripture:



The demands of the Gospel seem so total: to obtain the kingdom one has to sell everything. Yet it is also a process, a journey. What is most important is the movement and the direction of my life. Only the one who searches can find, those who are happy with where they are will never find anything worth giving their life for. Am I in a stagnant phase or am I still searching, digging deeper in the field of my heart? What chords has the experience of the pandemic touched in my heart and in that of my family?

Selling everything to obtain what they really desired so deeply filled both men in the parables with deep joy. This seems a contradiction, but this is what our experience tells us. As the prayer of St Francis puts it, It is in giving that we receive. I ask for heart full of freedom, freedom to give all and to receive all.

The parish recently upgraded and added to the technology in the church for sound and livestreaming! Thank you to Rick Kress for his knowledge and hard work to choose the new equipment, install it, and fine tune the entire sound system and livestreaming capabilities for use in the worship space. With Deacon Tom’s help at times, Rick spent hours stringing wire, installing a camera, and testing the new system. He continues to make adjustments as needed.

Religious Education is also benefitting from upgrades to technology with the help of a grant through the Diocese of Erie and the generosity of All Saints Knights of Columbus. Five new televisions on carts and laptop computers for use in Religious Education have been delivered and set up. With the uncertainty of in-person instruction this fall the timing was perfect. The possibility of sharing Religious Education lessons virtually can now be accomplished using this new equipment right here from the parish.
