### Next Weekend Nov. 17 & 18—2nd Collection— Campaign for Human Development

On the weekend of November 17-18, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Since 1970, the CCHD has contributed over \$300 million to more than 8,000 low-income led, community-based projects that strengthen families, create jobs, build affordable housing, fight crime, and improve schools and neighborhoods. CCHD requires that projects develop community leadership and participation so that their solutions to poverty will be longlasting and effective, and so that CCHD's investment in people will help break the cycle of poverty. All this is only possible with the help of generous Catholics like you. **Half of the funds from this collection remain here in the Diocese of Erie** to fight poverty in our local communities.
