REFLECT ON TODAY'S READINGS

FIRST READING EX 17:3-7

In his initial encounter with the Lord, Moses learns the name of God, "I AM." What insight does this give us into the nature of the divine?

SECOND READING ROM 5:1-2, 5-8

Paul believed that the past mistakes of the ancient Israelites in the desert served as an example of the dangers of too much self-confidence. How can one best avoid arrogance in faith?

GOSPEL READING JN 4:5-42

In the parable of the barren fig tree, Jesus taught the crowds of the need to repent in order to bear good fruit. For what do you need to repent in this season of Lent?

What is Almsgiving?

We all want to be "good Samaritans." When we see our sister or brother suffering, we are moved by compassion. We want to help. We are inspired to give. Almsgiving is central to how we practice Lent. Almsgiving flows from prayer and fasting. We reflect on the needs of the world and how God is calling us to meet those needs through prayer. We make room for the needs of others—and for the Holy Spirit to work within us through fasting. Through a recognition of the world's needs and a personal commitment to act, we give alms. What are alms? Alms are money or goods that are given to or other acts of charity that are performed for—those in need. Catholics look to the Catechism, which says that almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God."

In *your* Lenten journey, reflect on how your prayers, fasting and almsgiving can guide you. As Pope Francis explains, these are "elements which, when lived sincerely, can transform life and provide a sure foundation for dignity and fraternity."
