

We walk with Jesus this week seeking inspiration and hope, the essential keys needed to unlock the door to God's presence in our lives.

### **REFLECT ON TODAY'S READINGS**

### FIRST READING IS 43:16-21

We hear in today's reading how the prophet Isaiah suffered for his commitment to his call and for his fidelity to the Lord. And yet, Isaiah never lost his faith in God. When has your faith been put to the test?

# SECOND READING PHIL 3:8-14

Paul recites an early Christological hymn to the Philippians describing Jesus' human and divine nature. The hymn states that Jesus "did not regard equality with God something to be grasped." What do you think this assertion is teaching us about Jesus' dual nature?

### GOSPEL READING LK 22:14-23:56

In his account of the passion narrative, we hear how Luke emphasizes the innocence of Jesus, noting both Pilate and Herod (Antipas) find Jesus innocent. Why do you think Luke highlights the verdict of Jesus as "not guilty" of any capital crime?

## **Child Abuse Prevention Month**

Be Vigilant- Child Abuse Prevention Month should lead to heightened awareness of the need to be vigilant about providing a safe environment for all within the Church and for our communities. It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children and communicating our concerns to the appropriate parties. Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture of prevention. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. When we witness inappropriate behavior or something that just doesn't seem quite right, we must report our concerns through the appropriate channels.
