

The disciples saw how Jesus lived and dealt with the day's circumstances. They wanted that same faith and determination. They wanted his fortitude and courage. Mostly, they wanted Jesus' confidence and patience that God's vision would someday be fulfilled. In the meantime, waiting in joyful hope, we become servants who do what is necessary; love, repent of our sin, show mercy, be compassionate and fight injustice. "WE BELIEVE HE IS TRULY PRESENT ... " BY BISHOP LAWRENCE PERSICO

"Each time we receive Holy Communion, it's an opportunity of grace for us to encounter the risen Lord in the Eucharist. That's quite a statement, don't you think?
