

GECAC Farmers Market Nutrition Program

GECAC, through the PA Department of Agriculture's Farmer's Market Nutrition Program, will again make available \$20.00 vouchers for the purchase of fruits or vegetables that are grown in PA from our area farmer's market stands.

To be eligible, a senior must be an Erie County resident, 60 years of age or older in 2019, and meet the following 2019 income guidelines:

1 person \$23,107 or less 2 people \$31,284 or less SEE the BULLETIN BOARD for more...

Eligible seniors will be able to receive a voucher, while supplies last, through a one day event, which in <u>Waterford is Tuesday</u>, July 16, 9:00 AM to <u>Noon, at the Waterford Food Pantry</u>. Eligible seniors must be prepared to show proof of age and residency (not income). See the bulletin board for other locations based on residency.

JUST SAYING

Whatever happened to Limbo?

No, not that kind of limbo. You can probably still find that at your next Luau party. But what about the Limbo that the Catholic Church taught about?

Growing up, you may have heard that Limbo was the place where non-baptized children. Father Michael says that Limbo was one way that resolved the seeming contradiction between two authentic Church teachings – we need Baptism, and God wants everyone to be saved and with Him in Heaven. But Limbo has never been an official teaching of the Church. We don't know how God saves souls with his mercy, but we know He has a plan for each of His children's souls. How each soul is saved is a mystery to us, but that mystery doesn't hinder us from believing God has everything under control.

Father Michael writes, "If you study Scriptures and key Church documents you will find that nothing proposes Limbo as a settled and indisputable teaching. Indeed, it has none of the markers needed for permanent teaching."
