GOSPEL READING MT 20:1-16a

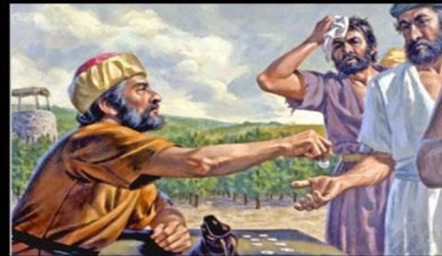

Lessons learned from the parable of workers in a vineyard.
