WORLD MISSION SUNDAY 2nd Collection TODAY

October is World Mission Month, dedicated to honoring the immeasurable impact missionaries and missionary work have on people and institutions here in the United States and abroad.

Expanding the celebration to an entire month gives parishioners more time to learn about our missions as Catholics and about the people who give tirelessly of their time, talents and energy to transform the world through missionary work, said Indira Suarez, director of Diocesan and International Missions for the diocese. Some of that work happens at the diocese-sponsored Mission of Friendship in Yucatán, Mexico, which operates a day care center, an after-school enrichment program, a medical dispensary, a family sponsorship program and a sister parish program that pairs parishes in the Yucatán with parishes in Erie.

"You can do any kind of missionary work, even in your own neighborhood," Suarez said. "Support your friends and family or people you don't even know. You don't have to go overseas to do missionary work. It's in your actions wherever you are. It's in the example of your life." Please be generous to this collection if you can.

A Family Perspective

While many good books abound on marriage and parenting. Jesus tells us in today's gospel the real secret: satisfying relationships depend on how well we sacrifice our needs to serve others. It is not about "getting," it's about "giving" ourselves.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments Bullying Prevention Month: Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or fabricated allegations that can damage relationships. Examples include social exclusion ("You can't be with us"), spreading rumors ("Did you hear...?"), and withholding friendship ("I won't be your friend if you..."). Though relational bullying can often seem ambiguous to outside observers and often garners less attention than physical bullying or verbal bullying, it should not be discounted simply as normal, adolescent behavior. In fact, several recent studies suggest relational bullying is more strongly related to emotional distress and teen depression than any other form of bullying. All Saints Day is almost here! Who is your favorite saint? We will highlight some of the saints as we prepare to celebrate our parish feast day "All Saints" on November 1st.



On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis canonized new saints including Saint Oscar Romero and Saint Pope Paul VI. In his homily, Francis said Archbishop Romero "left the security of the world, even his own safety, in order to give his life according to the Gospel, close to the poor and to his people." Of the pope, he said, "Even in the midst of tiredness and misunderstanding, Paul VI bore witness in a passionate way to the beauty and the joy of following Christ totally."

On October 4th Catholics celebrated the feast of **St. Francis of** Assisi, founder of the Franciscan orders of the Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare (the Poor Clares), and the lay Third Order. His evangelical zeal, consecration to poverty, charity, and personal charisma drew thousands of followers. Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favor of the latter, but always returned to solitude when he could.
