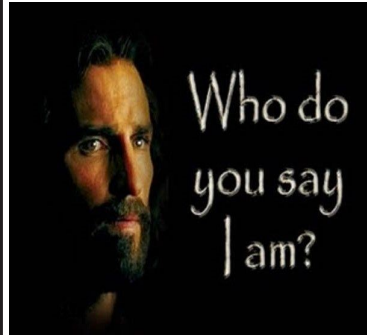
GOSPEL READING MT 16:13-20

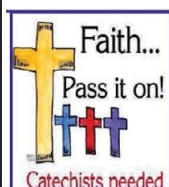
