

JUST SAYING -

The Epiphany of the Lord



We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus.

We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological.

Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. **Frankincense** is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple.

Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death.

Beloved Nights: Regroup as a Couple


