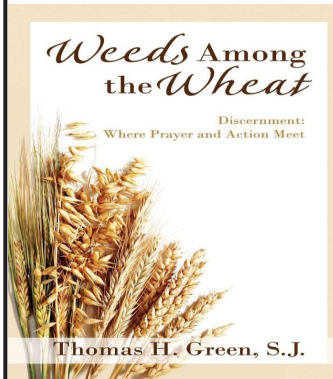

JUST SAYING -

In Weeds Among the Wheat, Thomas Green achieves an uncommon blend—a serious book for popular use, a popular book for serious reading.



With wisdom and common sense he engages the topic of discernment and shows that it is a function of an individual's personal relationship with God. “It is where prayer meets action. The more deeply we know the Lord, the easier it will be to ‘read his face’, and sense what he desires us to do.”

He draws on his experience as a spiritual director, on scripture, and on his study of the writing of Ignatius of Loyola, to provide a clear understanding of the meaning (the what) and the art (the how) of Christian discernment.

To answer the What, he explores the scriptures—the prophets, John, Paul and Jesus—to provide a sense of its biblical meaning.

To answer the How, he turns to Ignatius' “Discernment of Spirits” in the classic Spiritual Exercises. He then seeks to detect and explore the various species of “weeds” which grow alongside and intertwined with the good wheat in our lives. Some can be uprooted, others must be left until the Lord of the harvest sees fit to uproot them.

REFLECT ON TODAY'S READINGS

FIRST READING WIS 12:13

The Jewish sage speaks of God as master of all who judges us with clemency and governs us with leniency. What are some areas of your life that make you grateful for a merciful God?

SECOND READING ROM 8:26-27

Paul teaches the Christians in Rome that the Spirit helps us “to pray as we ought.” When do you find yourself most at prayer?

GOSPEL READING MT 13:24-43

We hear today a series of parables describing aspects of the kingdom of heaven: the parable of the weeds among the wheat, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the yeast. What do you think makes Jesus' parables such an effective method for teaching about the mystery of the kingdom of heaven?

Each session will last 10-15 minutes and you will have the opportunity to comment and share or to simply join and listen.

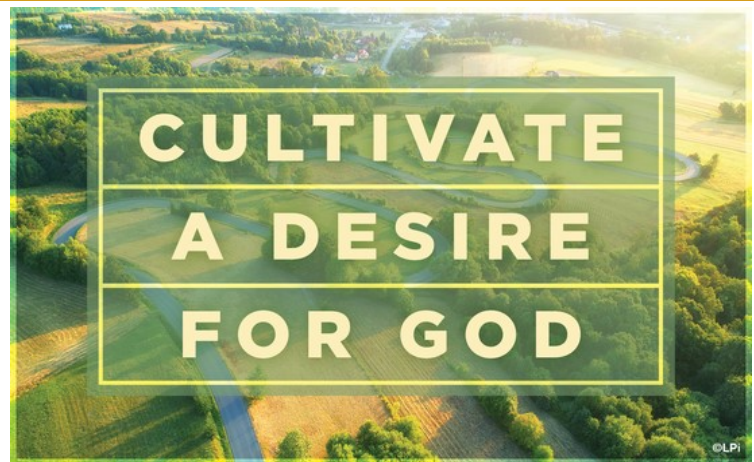
