JUST SAYING -

After the Korean War ended, South Korea was left with a large number of children who had been orphaned by the war. We've seen the same thing in Vietnam, in Bosnia, and in other places. In the case of Korea, relief agencies came in to deal with the problems of having so many orphaned children.

People involved in this relief effort shared a problem they encountered with the children who were in the orphanages. Even though the children had three meals a day provided for them, they were restless and anxious at night and had difficulty sleeping. The workers soon discovered that the children had great anxiety about whether they would have food the next day.

To help resolve this problem, the relief workers in one orphanage decided that each night when the children were put to bed, the nurses would place a single piece of bread in each child's hand. The bread wasn't intended to be eaten; it was simply to be held by the children as they went to sleep.

It was a "security blanket" for them, reminding them that there would be provision for their daily needs. Sure enough, the bread calmed the children's anxieties and helped them sleep.

We generally take comfort in knowing that our physical needs are met, that we have food, or "bread," for our needs.

How do we respond to that reminder in the challenges of our daily lives and what does give us our daily bread mean for each?

The petition for daily bread was about a new form of society, a new family in which all help each other to enable the continued proclamation of the reign of God.

It is about a form of solidarity we call agape which means that each thinks in terms of the other, and that each asks what the other needs and then helps out accordingly.

The goal of our communion in agape is to continue the apostolic work of proclaiming the Gospel through the actions of our lives.
