

Bishop Lawrence Persico discussed the parameters for eventually resuming public Mass in the Diocese of Erie at a Townhall Meeting on May 21st. (you can view this meeting on the diocesan website) The Bishop has stated that after a pastor has put in place a plan to work within the necessary parameters in his parish, he may then resume the celebration of Mass with the faithful.

Here at All Saints, we are looking at all of the protocols necessary for reopening as we plan ahead. As of the time this bulletin had to go to print (May 22nd) no changes have been made to what we are currently doing—no public Mass daily and weekend, and livestreaming Sunday's Mass.

- 6) Remember that God is in control. And that's a good thing!


A Family Perspective

Like the disciples in today's gospel, there are times we shut the doors of our hearts to people or events. It's how we create emotional distance. Permanent distancing is lethal and prevents the PEACE Jesus offers you today.

"Peace be with you...and (Jesus) breathed on them...Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them." (John 20:21-23) With Covid-19 physical distancing, we don't offer a hand at the Sign of Peace and we are careful not to breathe on others. BUT, this doesn't apply to spouses. So too, Jesus' last directive to forgive each other especially applies to spouses who may have become impatient with each other having been quarantined together for so long.
