

We ask all this in the name of your Son, our model of what it means to reverence our fathers. In Christ's name.



FIRST READING GEN 14:18-20

We hear in the reading from Genesis a victory meal of bread and wine between Abraham and Melchizedek, king of Salem. This is the Bible's first recorded meal of thanksgiving. Why do you think celebratory meals are so central to the storyline of the Bible?

SECOND READING 1 COR 11:23-26
