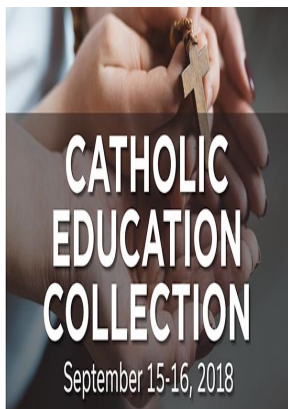

SACRAMENT INFORMATION-ALL SAINTS PARISH

Baptisms are scheduled by appointment. Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Pre-Baptism class.

Sponsor Certificates are available to those who meet the requirements: Baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Faith, at least 16 years of age, know and practice their faith through regular participation in the sacraments, and are registered members of the parish. Call the parish office to schedule a time to sign the sponsor certificate in the presence of the pastor.

Marriage couples should contact the pastor at least nine months before the date of the intended marriage. A Diocesan sponsored marriage preparation program is required.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults - please call the parish office if interested in becoming Catholic.

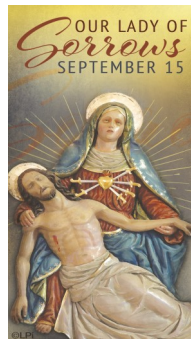
