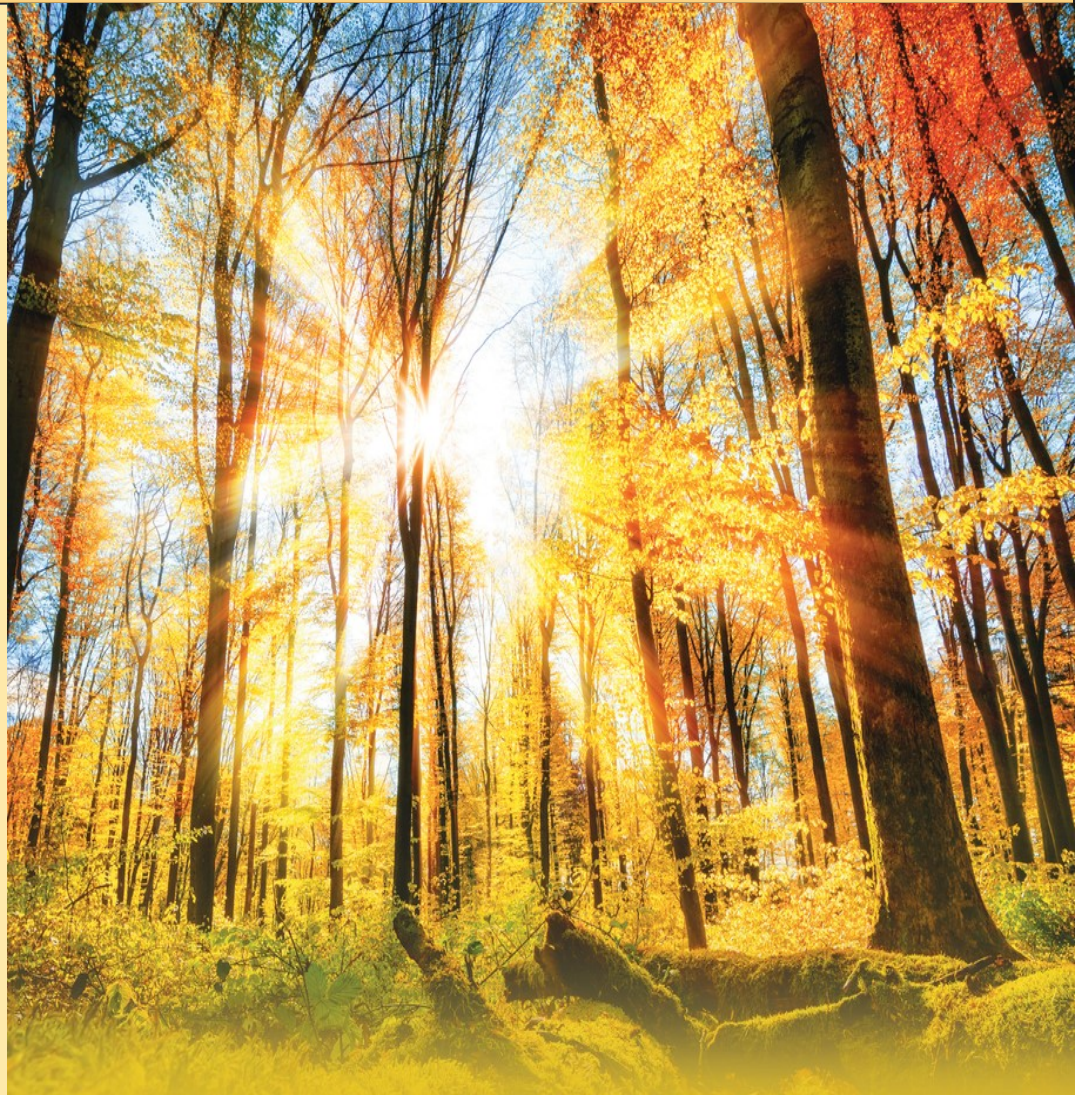

FIRST READING JER 20:7-9

In a prayer of lamentation, Jeremiah speaks of the loneliness and isolation of answering his prophetic call. What words of comfort would you offer Jeremiah?

SECOND READING RM 12:1-2

Paul urges fellow believers in Rome to remain focused on pleasing God. What do you find most challenging in this spiritual discipline?

GOSPEL READING MT 16:21-27

Peter and Jesus have an intense exchange of words over Jesus' revelation that as the Messiah, he will suffer and die. How often do you think there was tension between Jesus and his 12 apostles?

MARK YOUR CALENDARS:

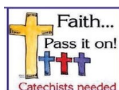

The United Nations World Food Program (WFP) recently released a report outlining the consequences of the pandemic and highlighted that the number of people facing extreme hunger could double this year unless swift action is taken. Perhaps now more than in any recent year is the time to heed God's call to care for the 'least among us.' Which makes our efforts all the more important.

As a member of the CROP family you know that the funds we raise each year provide meals, seeds, agricultural training, livestock and more to people living in extreme poverty. But social distancing has meant that many CROP Walks scheduled for earlier this year were canceled entirely with the subsequent loss of funds raised. We have the advantage of a fall Walk and we're hopeful that by working together - creatively, thankfully, faithfully - we can make up some of what was lost and enable CWS/ CROP to continue its work here and around the world. **Thanks for your help.**
