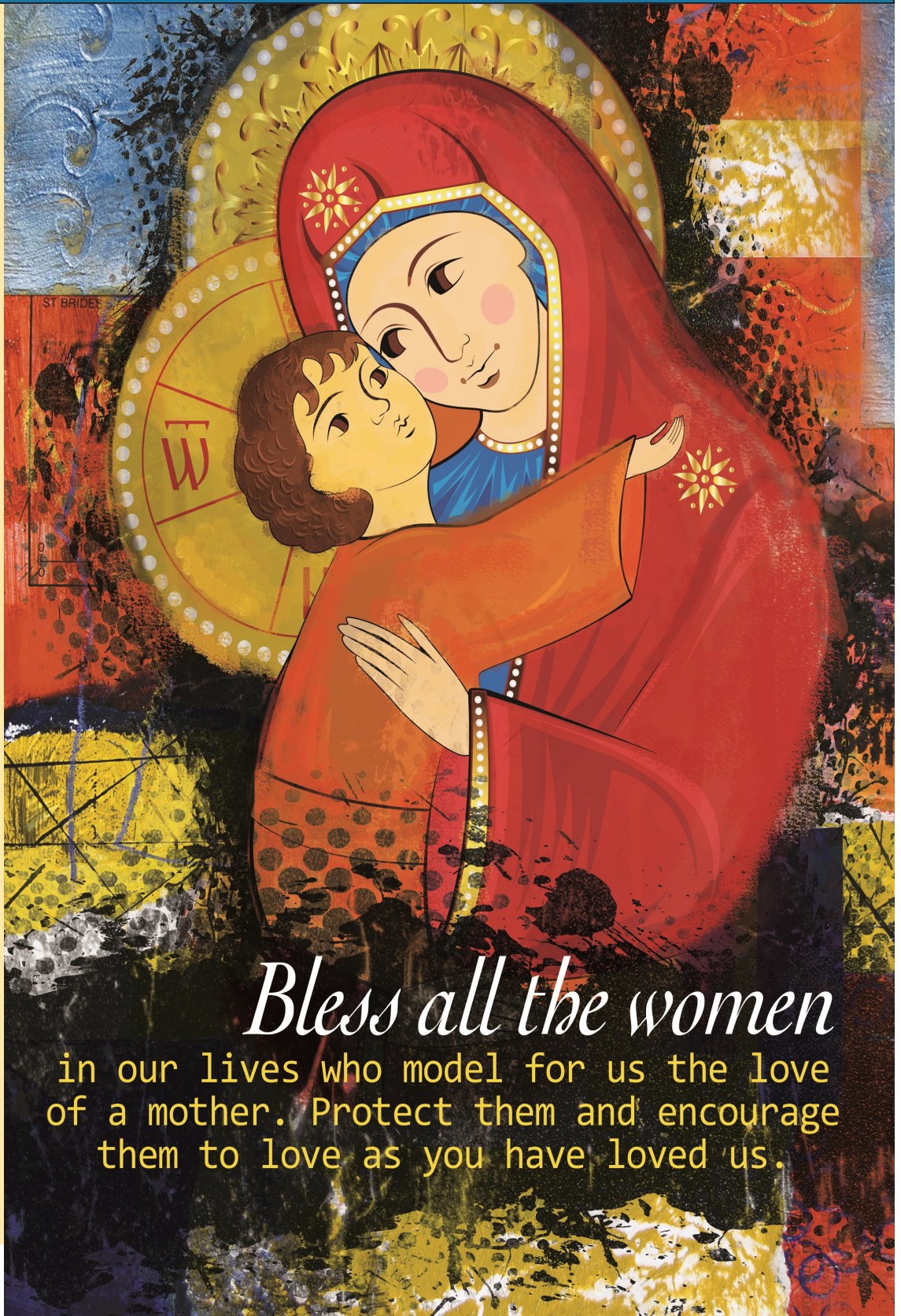

JUST SAYING -

HAIL, HOLY QUEEN



Remember that Mary always seeks to be a bridge not a barrier to Her Divine Son our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Don't ever feel afraid to approach her in prayer for grace, strength and her intercession to Jesus for your personal intentions.

The Hail Holy Queen prayer, originally known by its Latin name, Salve Regina, is recited at the end of the Rosary and is also used in night prayers. It dates back to around the 11th century and is still sung today as a hymn in various forms, among them a beautiful chant.

St. Alphonsus Liguori thought so highly of the Hail Holy Queen that he analyzed it in great detail in his well-known 18th century book *The Glories of Mary*. In this prayer we pay homage to the Blessed Virgin Mary, our "Mother of Mercy," and humbly ask for her assistance. Many religious over the centuries (including quite a few saints) have considered her help to be essential for our salvation.

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, Our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy towards us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement O loving O sweet Virgin Mary.
