JUST SAYING -

Pope Francis announced and inaugurated 2021 as a "Year in Honor of St. Joseph." This is in celebration of the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being named patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father's intention is that "every member of the faithful, following Joseph's example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfillment of God's will." With this in mind, I invite you to grow closer to St. Joseph in 2021. **The Diocese of Erie invites all to pray a Novena to St. Joseph beginning March 11 and concluding March 19. Pray each day:**

O Glorious Saint Joseph, you were chosen by God to be the foster father of Jesus, the most precious spouse of Mary ever Virgin, and the head of the holy family. You have been chosen as the heavenly patron and protector of the Church. Therefore, it is with great confidence that we implore your assistance for the Church on earth. Protect with fatherly love Pope Francis, Bishop Persico and all those who labor for souls amid the trials of life.

Dear Saint Joseph, ever be our father, protector, and guide. Obtain for us purity of heart. May all our actions be directed to the greater glory of God, in union with the Immaculate Heart of Mary and your own paternal heart. Finally, pray for us that we may share in the peace and joy of a holy death and be found ready to dwell in the glory of your Son. For He lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen."
