PALM SUNDAY—TODAY

Palms will be blessed in the church, rather than in the gathering space at the beginning of Mass. Palms will be handed out by the ushers (who will be wearing gloves).

HOLY THURSDAY, APRIL 1

7:00 PM Mass of the Lord's Supper
There will be no “washing of the feet” at this year's Mass due to the pandemic. At the end of the Mass the Blessed Sacrament will be taken from the sanctuary in procession but will be returned and placed on the altar (instead of in the Chapel) for ADORATION until 9:00 PM. You are invited to stay after Mass, staying socially distanced in the church, to quietly pray and adore the Blessed Sacrament.

GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 2

2:00 PM Celebration of the Lord's Passion
Adoration of the Holy Cross: Once the showing of the cross has taken place, the people adore the cross in one of two ways: 1) The minister holds the cross aloft for a time allowing the people to venerate the cross from their place in the pews. 2) The people may process forward to venerate the cross with a bow or a genuflection but not by touching or kissing the cross. All leave the worship space in silence.

EASTER VIGIL, APRIL 3

(Ushers will seat people to social distance.)
8:30 PM the Vigil begins. The Service of Light will take place in the church rather than the gathering space at the beginning of the Vigil. There will be no individual candles used this year. The Exultant will be sung. The Sprinkling Rite will take place after the Renewal of Baptismal Promises. Fr. Greg and Deacon Tom will stand in the front of the church to do the sprinkling. They will not be walking through the congregation.

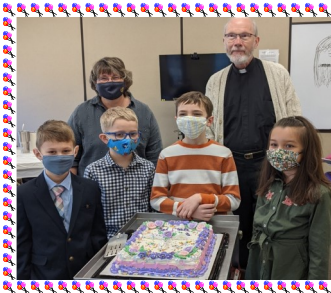

FIRST READING IS 50:4-7
