A Letter from Bishop Persico for the upcoming collection—“HELP SPREAD THE FAITH”—Diocesan Communications January 26 & 27

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have always understood the value of good communications. The work I've been called to as bishop of the Diocese of Erie is not done in a vacuum. Responding to the needs that surfaced early in my tenure, I took a collaborative approach to restructuring in both schools and parishes. I consulted with many advisors, but also opened the conversation to all parishioners, inviting feedback and using it to help shape our future. I also have worked to keep you informed about my responses to the serious challenges of the past year. A number of people have asked me how they could be helpful to me after the release of the grand jury report. One way is to stay informed. Read the statements I've issued along the way, rather than relying on headlines or social media posts that don't always capture the full story. When the subject comes up with family, friends or colleagues, encourage them to do the same.

One way to stay informed is to visit www.ErieRCD.org. We now have an even more userfriendly site with state-of-the-art technology that makes it easy for you to access, whether you are on a laptop, a tablet or your phone. Our homepage has a link to all of my statements, and the news tab will take you to our latest stories. While you're there, be sure to subscribe to our free, weekly Diocese of ErieE-news, an engaging mix of links to diocesan, national and international news of interest to Catholics. I am grateful for your contributions to the Help Spread the Faith campaign scheduled to take place in parishes the weekend of Jan. 26-27, 2019.
