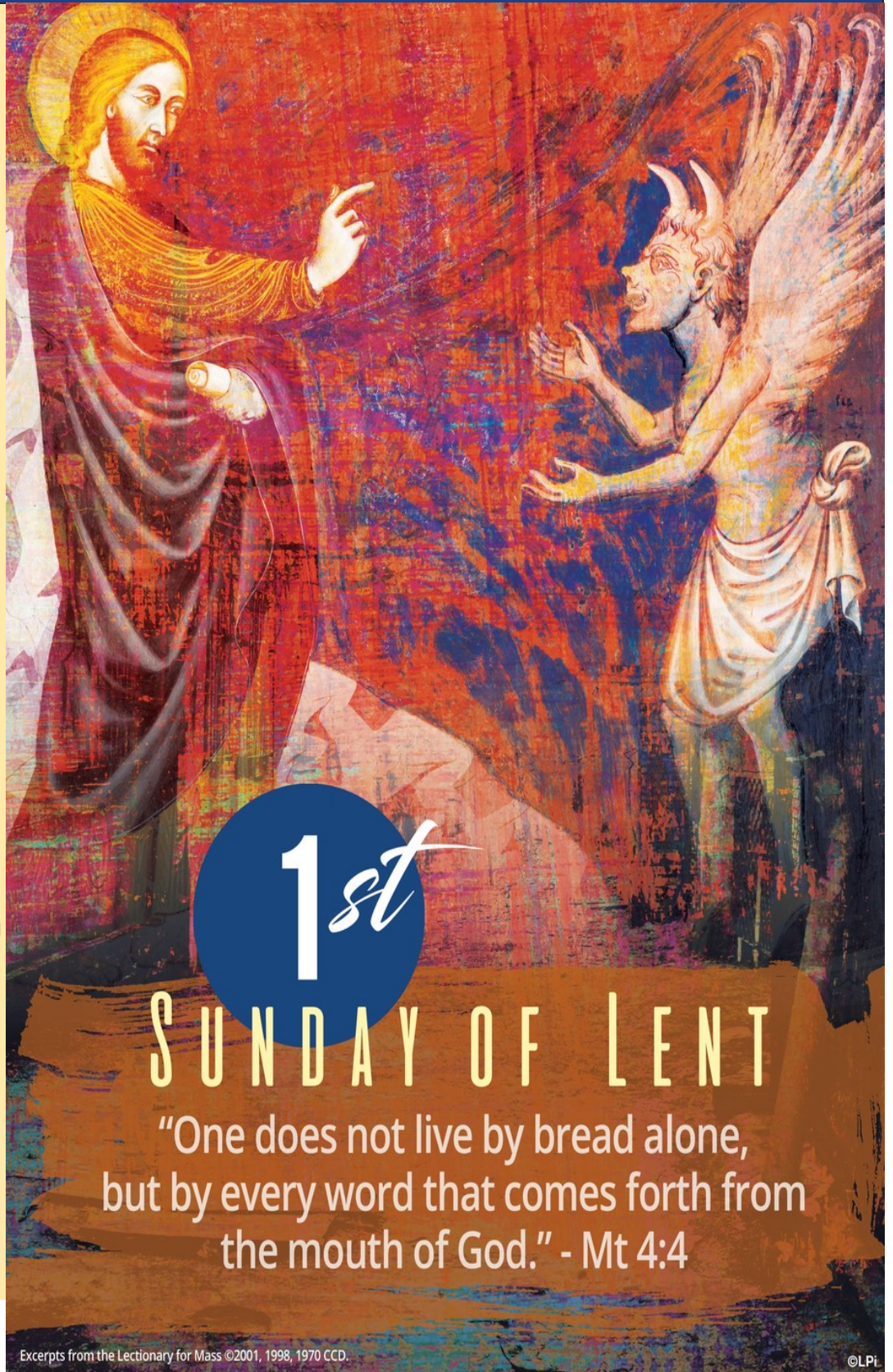

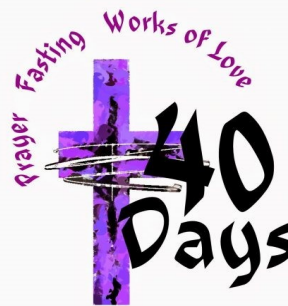

JUST SAYING

The readings of this First Sunday of Lent act as a kind of overture to the entire season.



They enable us to engage in a double confession: a confession of sin and the repentance that follows; and a confession of praise for the mercy of God, which is shown us in spite of our sin.

They sketch the contours of the human condition—broken and death-bound; they give us a glimpse of God's unqualified mercy; and they invite us to look at Jesus, who is our way to God's mercy.

TUESDAY EVENING LENTEN FAITH FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES AT ALL SAINTS—



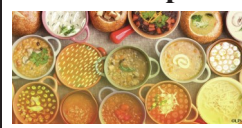
