We miss you when you're away. Before you leave to enjoy your well deserved getaway please consider automating your gifts to our parish by utilizing our online giving platform, WeShare.





THIS WEEK IN OUR PARISH:

As we gather today to reaffirm our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we are reminded that WE are also the Body of Christ. The mission of the Gospel calls us to be Christ for others. There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost and feeling lonely, marginalized and oppressed, victimized and abused. Every time we receive the Body (and Blood) of Christ we are asked to become what we eat. Are we willing to step aside from our preoccupations and concerns so that we can be Christ for others?



The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us. In receiving this transforming presence of Christ, we can truly effect change in the lives of those we meet. We can show them God's unconditional, ever-present love and the beauty that can come from loving others. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go.

REFLECT ON TODAY'S READINGS

FIRST READING EX 24:3-8

Moses and the ancient Israelites ratified the covenant God established with them at Mount Sinai with the blood of a sacrificed animal. The sacrificed animal affirmed Israel's commitment: "We will do everything the Lord has told us." Why do you think Israel tied sacrificed blood to their verbal commitment?

SECOND READING HEB 9:11-15

The author of Hebrews teaches us that the sacrificed blood of Christ sanctifies us and offers us eternal redemption. How do you see this connected to ancient Israel's practice of sacrificing animals for their blood?

GOSPEL READING MK 14:12-16, 22-26

Mark's account of the institution of the Eucharist is linked to the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread when a Passover lamb was sacrificed. What do you think Mark is teaching us in making this connection?

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments— Teach your child to protect him/herself at home:

We consider our homes to be safe places for our children but, being home alone can pose risks for children. Here are a few tips to teach kids that will help keep them safe when you are not with them at home: Teach children to never answer the door if home alone. Don't tell anyone, on the phone, on social media or while gaming, that your parents are not home. Do not allow friends into the home without the permission of a parent or babysitter. Check in with Mom or Dad at set times during the day. Parents should reinforce the rules each time they leave a child home alone. A Family Perspective

The main parameters parishes in the Diocese of Erie are being asked to observe in the revised protocols for the celebration of public Masses include those listed below:

• Individuals are no longer required to wear masks when in church. Those who are not fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear masks while in church, both for their protection and that of others. • The use of all pews in churches is now permitted.

Among the protocols that have been in place and remain in effect: • Although the Eucharist continues to be offered at Mass, the distribution of the Precious Blood still is not permitted. • Nothing may remain in pews, including hymnals. • Hand

- Nothing may remain in pews, including hymnals. Hand sanitizer is to be available at the church entrance for parishioners.
- Collection baskets are not to be used in the pews. Those approaching to receive the Eucharist are encouraged to sanitize their hands before getting in line. Parishioners who are not feeling well are to stay home.

The Most Rev. Lawrence T. Persico, bishop of Erie, has issued this decree revising the protocols concerning the celebration of public Masses. It is essential for the public to be aware that even as restrictions are being eased, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and holy day Masses remains in place.
