In today's Gospel, we encounter Jesus overturning the tables of the money changers and driving out with a whip those who had turned the temple into a marketplace (Jn 2:13-15). In the midst of this cleansing from activities that were defacing its holiness and taking advantage of those who had journeyed long and far, he teaches them that He would raise the temple, His body, in three days (Jn 2:19). Christ does not limit his resurrection to a select few. All of us are invited into the mystery of his life, death, and resurrection. Consistently in the Gospels, we see Christ's unlimited, unconditional giving of himself, intentionally encountering those on the peripheries of the time: Gentiles, tax-collectors, servants, women, children, widows, the ill, lepers; even to those who denied him and the thief who was executed next to him.

Who is on our peripheries today? Who are our modern lepers, today's untouchables? How can we imitate our Lord in cleansing our temples and our communities of injustices and abuses? How can we simultaneously join that righteous anger with the grace to unconditionally extend participation in Christ's saving work to all?
