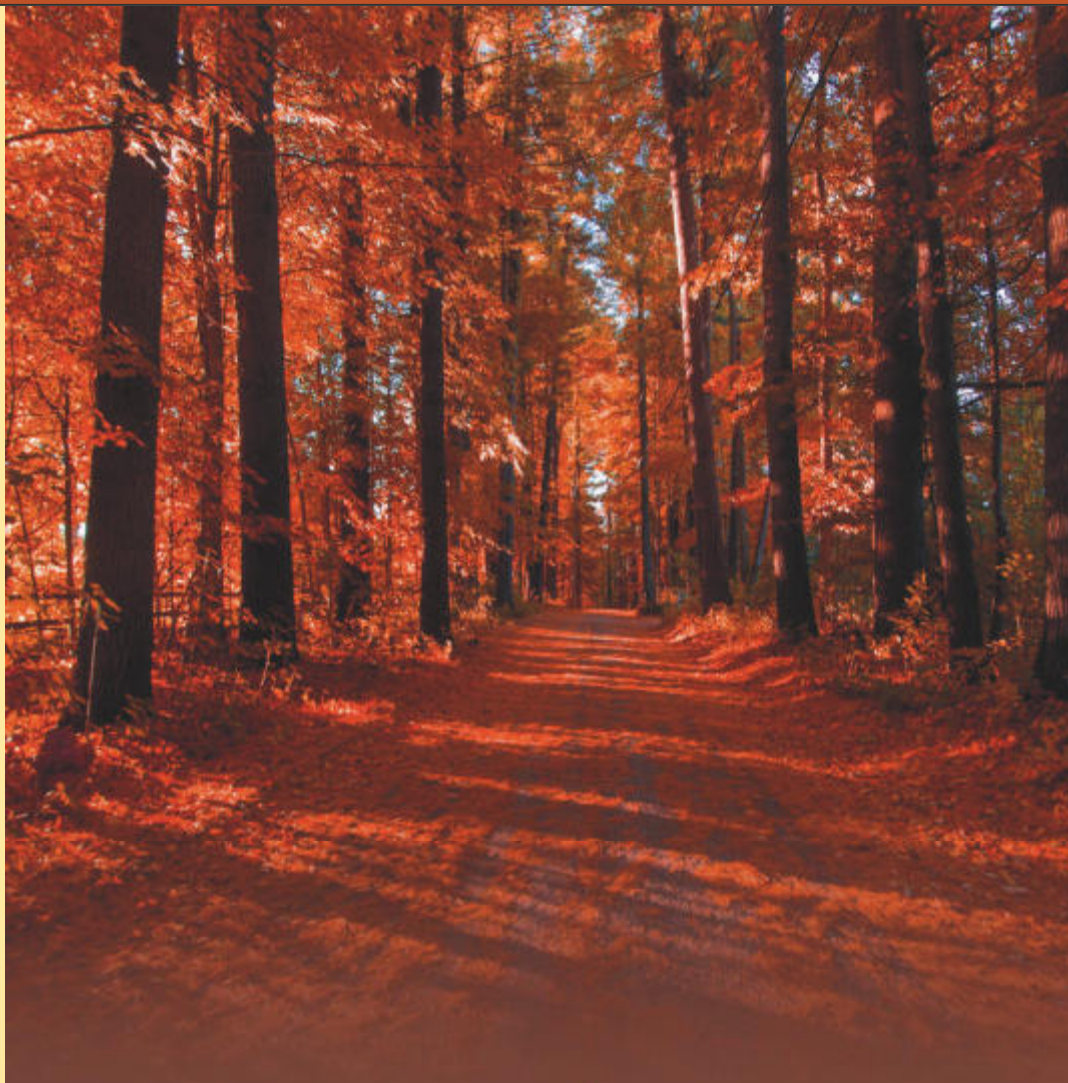

REFLECT ON TODAY’S READINGS

FIRST READING DAN 12:1-3

The prophet Daniel foresees a time of “unsurpassed distress” where all receive divine judgement of either everlasting life or everlasting disgrace. Do thoughts of the end times bring you comfort or concern?

SECOND READING HEB 10:11-14, 18

The author of Hebrews continues to emphasize Jesus’ death as the definitive and final sacrificial offering for sins. Why do you think this is a central theme in the Letter to the Hebrews?

GOSPEL READING MK 13:24-32

Jesus speaks of his Second Coming at the end of time and warns his disciples: “Be watchful! Be alert!” How are you preparing for judgment day?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

On the weekend of November 20-21, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). As you may know, CCHD is the national anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops which works to break the cycle of poverty by helping people with low income participate in decisions that affect their lives, families, and communities.

Half of the funds from this collection remain in the Diocese of Erie to fight poverty in our local communities. CCHD is a manifestation of our call to a discipleship that fosters a “solidarity which ‘would allow all peoples to become the artisans of their destiny’” (Evangelii Gaudium, no.190). The Gospel message compels us to assist others in finding creative solutions to poverty, so that we are able to break the cycle of dependence and powerlessness in society.

This work is not possible without the support of dedicated Catholics like you.
