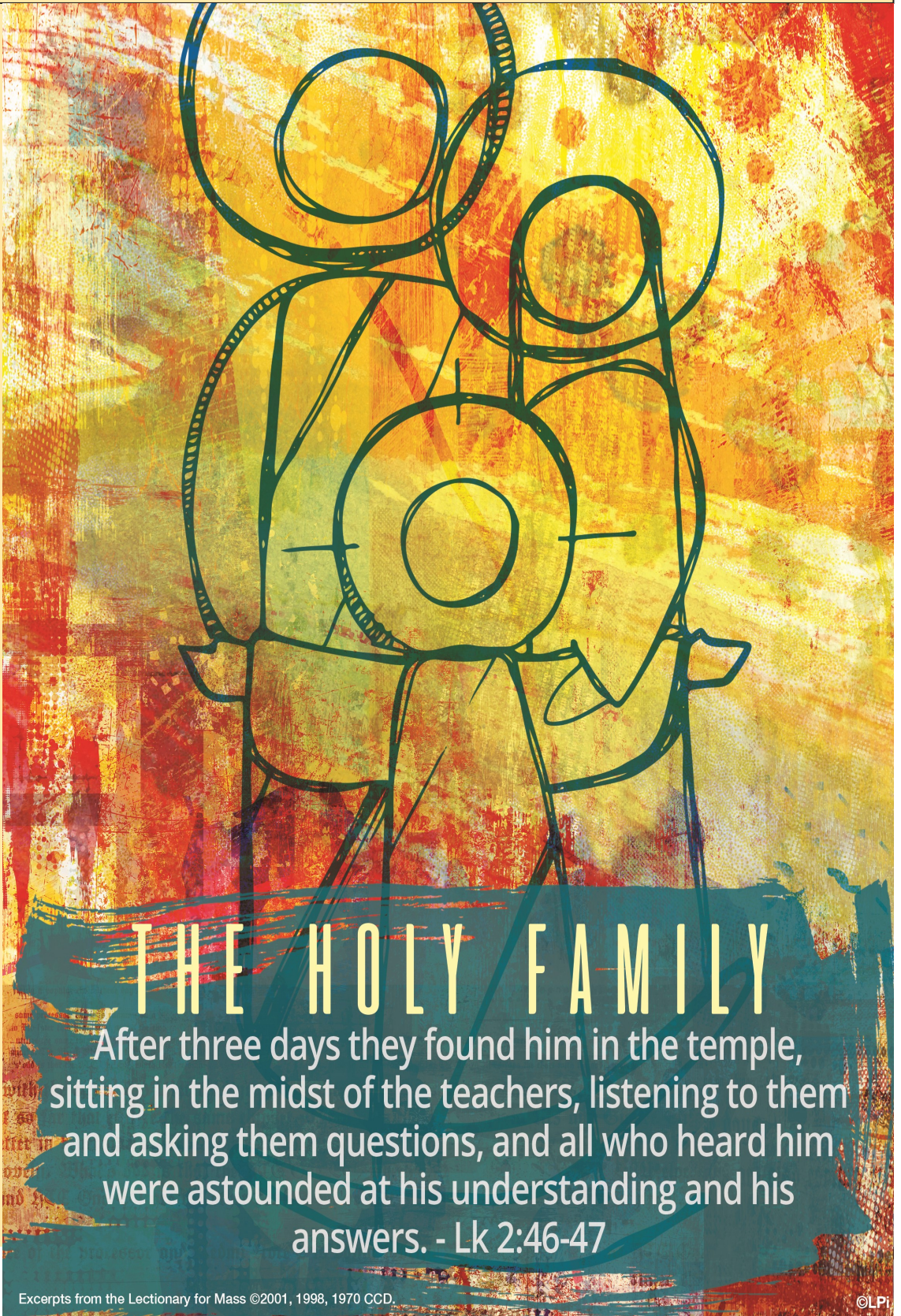

JUST SAYING -



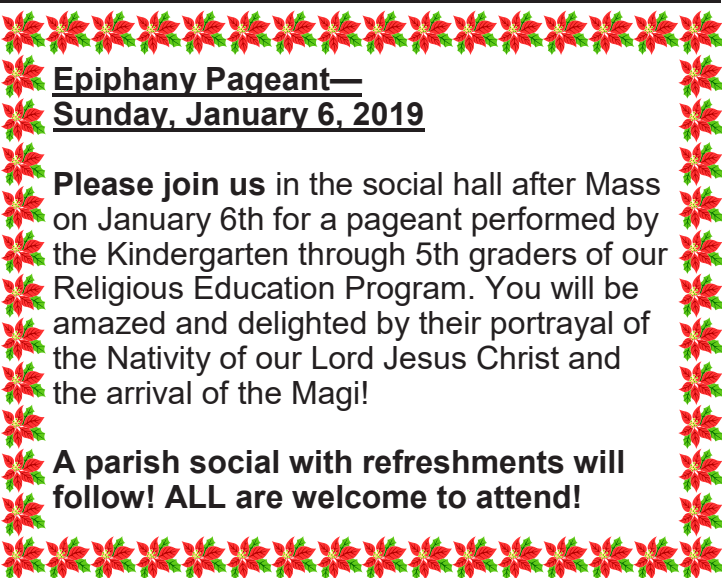
Jesus lived unseen in his family at Nazareth for about thirty years. Christmas season assures us that he lives, often unseen, in our lives even now.

9th Grade Poster "DO IT ANYWAY" was transferred on to tee-shirts by Mrs. Burkley for her class for Christmas.



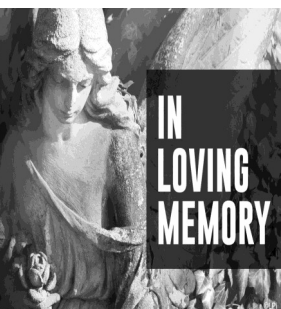
