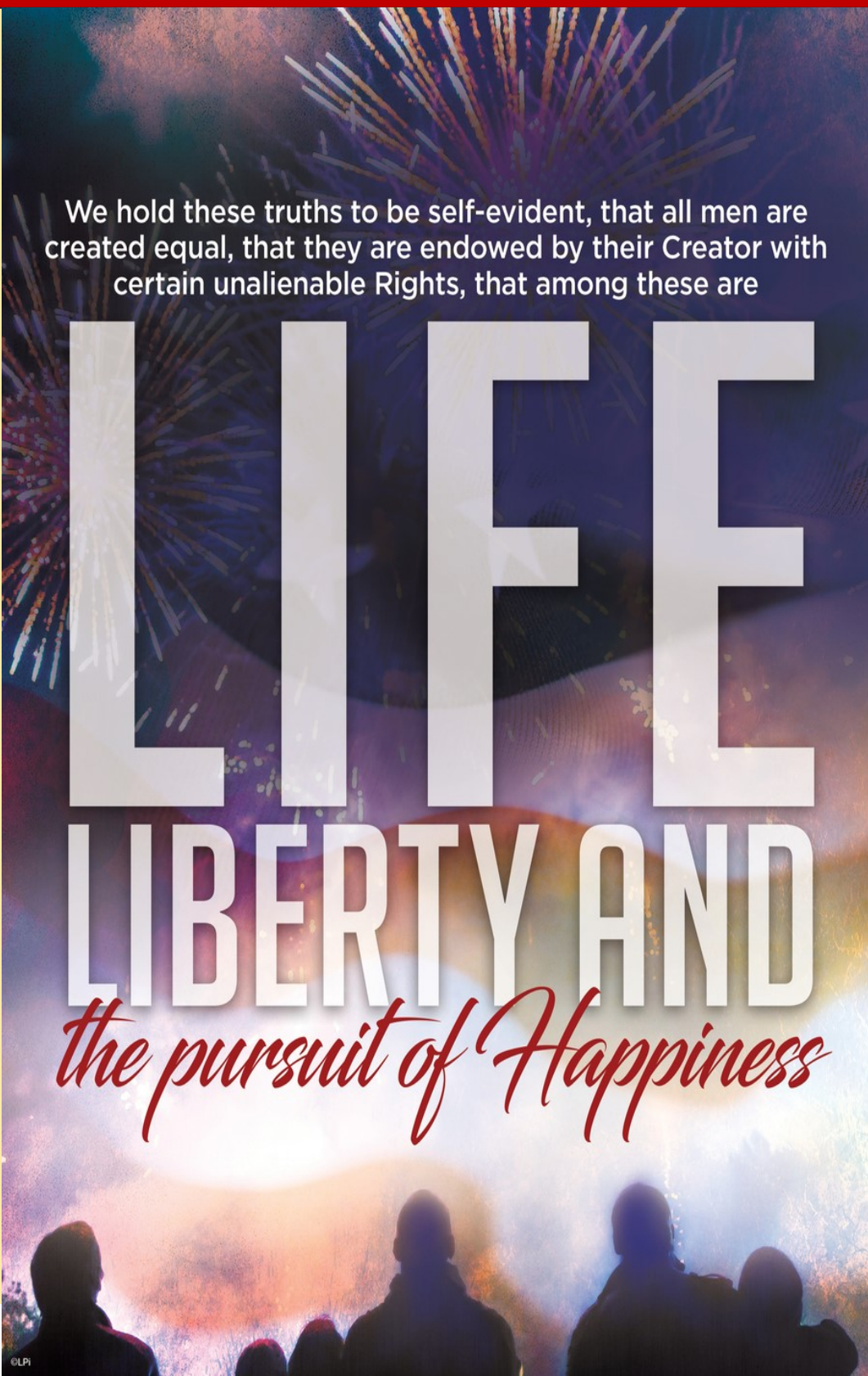

FIRST READING ZEC 9:9-10

The prophet Zechariah envisioned a future king for the people of Israel who would rule the nations with justice and humility. How do you see these virtues as a strength in leadership?

SECOND READING ROM 8:9, 11-13

Paul speaks of the promise of the resurrection from the dead for believers who reject the flesh and live according to the Spirit. What spiritual exercises do you practice that help reject the flesh?

GOSPEL READING MT 11:25-30

Jesus praises his Father for the irony of the wise and learned who are unable to see what is revealed to the childlike. What does this tell us about the kingdom of heaven?

 **Welcome Back!**

We are happy to be able to share the Eucharist again!

Fr. Greg and Deacon Tom will outline the flow and the movement of the Mass as we begin gathering again in the church. Thank you in advance for your patience.

The practice will be to go straight to and from your cars and not congregate in the gathering space or parking lot before or after Mass.

Thank you for making a reservation for the Mass you plan to attend EACH WEEK. Call or email the parish office, or sign-up on myParish app or our parish website on Mon., Tues., and Thurs. mornings. (The parish office is closed on Wednesdays.) Once we reach our capacity of 90 people including families we cannot accommodate more people in the building. You may watch the livestream from your car and it may be possible to drive through the circle after Mass for communion. We will see if this is needed.

Thank you for wearing a facemask. You will not be permitted to enter the church without one. We may have some extras in the gathering space if you forget.

Bring your mobile device to use for the order of Mass. There will be no hymnals in the pews. My Parish App has the order of Mass and readings. Please do put your device in the silent mode. You may bring your own prayer book.

The collection basket will be placed on a stand and you may drop in your donation as you enter or exit the worship space. Online giving is a great option!

And remember, Bishop Persico has announced that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses remains in effect.

A Family Perspective

Today's gospel is about being missionaries. As Jesus accepted his mission, parents accept the mission of raising a family. Parents are not alone in this exhausting and difficult vocation. Today Jesus calls us to himself when he invites us to "Come to me and I will give your rest."

Although the coronavirus has been hard on everybody, it is especially difficult for those who live alone. Cherish the companionship you share. Who do you know who doesn't have someone at home to talk with? Given them a call.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments- Know the Warning Signs of Abuse:

Those who abuse children look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that we should know to avoid. Rather, most abusers are known to the child, such as the parent, sibling, parent's paramour, parent's spouse, other relative or babysitter. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor the interactions, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids.
