PASTOR'S LETTER

The Work of the People

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we come to a part of the Liturgy that truly becomes the "work of the people" in what is done and in the way it is done. Last week we finished the part of the Mass we call the *Liturgy of the Word* and before we move into the *Liturgy of the Eucharist* there is an "in between time". Remember way back at the beginning of this series I said that the Liturgy is our entire life in Christ in microcosm. This in-between time in the Liturgy reminds us of the fact that with regard to God's Kingdom, we live in an in-between time. This time began with the first coming of Christ and will end with the second coming.

If you think about it, this is what the Season of Advent is about as well. In Advent we prepare for and celebrate the three comings of Christ: Christ coming into time as a human being; Christ coming at the end of time; Christ coming into our lives daily. The scripture and liturgy of the Season of Advent is intended to help us recognize and prepare for these "comings".

What are we to do as we live in this "in between time"? How are we to live? How are we to respond to God and to one another? In a simple phrase, we are to be gift for others as Christ is gift for us. This is what this inbetween time in the Liturgy is about as well, presenting and receiving gifts.

As we sit after the Creed, the collection is taken. This is not, as I have heard from some, "paying my dues." This is not merely some material way to support the work of the church although it is that. In the early church as people gathered in the larger homes in the community to celebrate the Lord's Supper, they brought gifts of the fruit of their hands. Mostly, they brought food that was used for an *agape* meal after the prayer and that was also distributed to meet the needs of the poor especially the widows and orphans. In his Letter to the Corinthians Paul chastises the wealthy of the community because they were excluding those who, because of their meager means, could not provide more for the meal.

In our day, we don't bring food to the feast but we do bring what can buy food; we bring the fruit of our labor; we bring our offering, our money. As we place our offering in the collection basket, we are doing something much deeper and much more important as well. We are offering; we are giving of ourselves. We are becoming gift for others, as Christ is gift for us.

We then bring forward in procession our material offering as well as the bread and wine that become Christ's body and blood. This bread and wine also represent the gift of ourselves. We offer these gifts to God by placing them on the altar. Now, we can't all literally get up on the altar, but we do allow these gifts to represent our

lives that we now give back to God. If we are serious about this, it means that we give all that God has given to us (gifts, talents, energy, material goods) back to God to be used as God wills. This is obviously something very powerful. With what intention and attitude do we do this each week?

As these gifts of bread and wine and self are presented and received by God, we then pray the Prayer Over the Gifts. This is a prayer that asks God to accept these humble yet very impressive and meaningful gifts. And God does.
