The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Today is the Thirty-Fourth or last Sunday in ordinary Time. Its official name is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and observance celebrating an aspect of Jesus identity rather than his life. Conventional understandings of kingship and power are transformed. Rather than calling up images of Jesus Christ addressed in kingly robes, the gospel proclaims him as king by the sign over his head on the throne of a wooden cross.

In the reading from the Book of Samuel the tribes of Israel anointed David as their king, although it is the God who proclaims this role for David. The image of Shepherd was associated with the King of Israel and David is to assume that same character. Generations later Jesus, who will come from the house of David, will take on that same identity and refer to himself as the Good Shepherd.

In his Letter to the Colossians Paul invites this early community to give thanks to the Father for "his beloved son" Jesus Christ. Paul lists several identities for Christ: "firstborn of all creation," "head of the body, the church," "the beginning" and "firstborn from the dead." These titles are intended to call the believers to a posture of praise and thanksgiving and to proclaim that God's redemption and forgiveness of sin is universal through the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross.

The Crucifixion scene in Luke's Gospel offered the irony of Christ being taunted but also being recognized as going to Paradise, the Kingdom of the Father. The jeers of the soldiers, "if you are King of the Jews," echo the mocking of the tempter in the desert, "if you are the Son of God." At the beginning of his earthly mission and at the end Jesus' self-identity is challenged. But in both encounters he remains faithful to the will of his Father.

The reflection for this Solemnity is from Mary Stommes who is editor of *Give Us This Day*.

The repentant criminal wasn't asking for much: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Remember me. That's all.

The Heart of Mercy longs for so much more: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

It's a perfect and poignant conversation on this feast of Christ the King. Remember the conversation.

Remember the King. Mercy is his might. And forgiveness. He came not to be served but to serve. He notices the lost and lonely, the forsaken and forgotten. And he seeks them out, most often unbidden. Just because.

Just because he is the visible face of the invisible Father. And the Father is all mercy and goodness, all forgiveness and compassion and tenderness—all of Remember also that mercy is without end. Though we officially conclude the Jubilee Year of Mercy today, we don't "move on" from mercy. We move on with mercy.

"Lord, have mercy."

"Christ, have mercy."

"Lamb of God, have mercy."

And over and over again.

God doesn't think we are asking for too much. Not at all.

And all that God asks is that we accept the mercy and let it flow . . . and behold the Kingdom of God being created right in our midst.
