The Work of the People The Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

This past week we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints as well as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. It is a time when we once again remember that we are a part of something greater than ourselves – the Communion of Saints. We are a part of a caring, faithful, and prayerful community that surrounds us and that supports us. Through the Book of the Names of the Dead, we honor and give thanks for all who have gone before us and for all who stand with us.

On this Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time we hear first from the Book of Wisdom. The author of this text addresses God as Creator of the whole universe. There is an immensity about the creator that is described through a contrast with creation as a grain or a drop of dew. This contrast serves to instill awe at the greatness of God's love of all that is created and to offer praise to God who has placed "your imperishable spirit" in all things.

Today we begin a series of passages from the second Letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. Paul assures the brothers and sisters in Thessalonica that he constantly prays for them; he encourages them to be steadfast in their calling as disciples. Though Paul brought the word of Jesus Christ to them, he reminds them that their calling has come from God. It is the grace of God that will give them strength; they have no need to be "shaken" in their gathering in the Lord's name.

In today's Gospel Luke recounts for us the delightful story of Jesus inviting himself to the home of Zacchaeus. It is one of the many teaching stories of Jesus that takes place in connection with the meal. The presence of Jesus and his house moves Zacchaeus to repent of his wrongdoing and promise to change his life. The grumbling of the crowd leads Jesus to state his mission "to seek and save what was lost."

The reflection for this Sunday is from Fr. John Meoska, OSB who is a monk of Saint John's Abbey and serves as the community formation director and novice master.

Stunning photographs from the International Space Station have shown us how small, beautiful, and fragile planet Earth truly is. It's a perspective we get only by climbing into outer space. The author of the Book of Wisdom describes the whole universe as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew: fragile, diminutive, but of infinite value. Why? Because God loathes nothing God made.

Each human also has infinite value. Not only are we held in being by God's love, but God's imperishable spirit and mercy are forever re-creating and healing us. We are touched sinners, loved sinners. How difficult it can be at times to hold in balance those two realitiesthat we are sinful and we are loved. It is so easy to imagine myself as unlovable on the one hand, or incapable of sin, on the other. We are sinners, but God's rebuke of us sinners is "little by little"; and God's desire to save, great.

God's grace in us will "bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith." Grace moved the diminu-tive Zacchaeus to climb a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus; and grace also moved this tax collector to rise above his sins of extortion and greed. St. Paul, today, warns us "not to be shaken out of our minds" at the coming of Christ; but that is the very thing that happened to Zacchaeus! He experienced conversion: "little by little," a change of mind, a change of heart, a change of life.
