

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners,

The Work of the People

The Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last week I wrote about the tabernacle and the primary reason for it's being in a church building, *viaticum* or communion to the sick. I also wrote about the Sacrament as we celebrate it and as we reserve it. There are secondary reasons for Eucharistic reservation and most of these have to do with Eucharistic adoration. "The primary and original reason for reservation of the eucharist outside Mass is the administration of *viaticum*. The secondary ends are the giving of communion and the adoration of our Lord Jesus Christ present in the sacrament" (*Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass, #5*). While adoration of the Eucharist outside of Mass is to be promoted, it remains secondary to the gathering of God's people in celebration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist in the Mass. One (adoration) grows from the other (celebration).

What are the reasons for this reservation besides *viaticum* and adoration? For many years now there have been provisions made for the reception of Holy Communion in the absence of a priest. This is not the "deacon's Mass" or a "lay Mass" but provides people with the opportunity for communion on a day when the Eucharistic Celebration cannot take place. The only similarity that such a service may have to Mass is the proclamation of the Word for the particular day. The Eucharist is also reserved after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday of the Triduum. This is because Mass is not celebrated on Friday or Saturday (during the day) of those three Holy Days. People may receive communion at the principle service of Good Friday.

Eucharistic adoration takes a few basic forms. There is Exposition and Benediction, so named because of the blessing given at the end of the service. Benediction is not to be offered except in the context of another prayer such as Stations of the Cross or a Holy Hour. Another form of Eucharistic adoration is what has been called Eucharistic Days (sometimes called "Forty Hours") where there are prayers and scripture readings along with homilies pertaining to the Eucharist. Some parishes or groups have sought and been granted permission for longer periods of exposition for the purpose of Eucharistic adoration. Some do this on the First Friday of each month and some even have perpetual

adoration. Special chapels are established for something like this.

The Eucharist is also reserved within church buildings so that people will have the opportunity for individual prayer in the presence of the Eucharist. Some find this very helpful to the growth of their spiritual life. No matter what form adoration (whether personal or communal) takes, it is always understood that this (adoration) is not to stand on its own or replace the primary source of our life in Christ, the Eucharistic celebration. Adoration is to flow from the Mass and lead us back to it. In this way the tabernacle, reservation of the Eucharist and Eucharistic adoration are seen in their proper context.

Next week I will look at other objects within the church building such as statues.
