PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners,

The Work of the People

The Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we continue with the Eucharistic Prayer. We had gotten as far as the Memorial or Eucharistic Acclamation through which we express a tenet that is central to our faith: "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again." Notice the use of tense in this particular acclamation. It demonstrates that we have a sense of the presence and action of Christ in all of time, past, present, and future. The action of Christ in giving his life for our salvation is not something that is merely a past event. It happens today and indeed every time we gather to celebrate the Lord's Supper as Jesus told us to do: "Do this in memory of me."

After the Memorial Acclamation, we move into a series of intercessory prayers. I have spoken of intercessory prayer when I discussed the General Intercessions and here once again we turn to God to ask for what we need in order to deepen our relationship with God and God's People.

In Eucharistic Prayer II we first thank God for calling us together into God's presence in order that we might be God's people. We then pray for unity among us who gather in prayer and, indeed, among all people. This unity we know to be a gift of the Spirit. We ask God to remember the Church (the People of God) and we pray specifically for the leaders of the Church, the pope and the local diocesan bishop.

We then ask God to welcome our dead, "our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection", and all who have died. We recognize that God is the one who truly knows the hearts and actions of any who have died and so we don't judge through this prayer.

We then pray for ourselves that God may "have mercy on us all" and "we may merit to be coheirs to eternal life." We then remember all the people who have set good examples for us to follow (Mary and the saints) and we ask that we might give continual praise and glory to God not only in this prayer but also in all that we do.

We then end the Eucharistic Prayer with another of the great acclamations, the Doxology and the Great Amen. A doxology is any prayer of praise to God and in this particular doxology we pray that we may always give "glory and honor" to God. Again, the word "Amen" is an expression of faith in what has gone before. It can mean "So be it" or "I believe" or "Yes, let it be so." We call this the "Great Amen" because it is our response to the whole of the Eucharistic Prayer and to God's presence and action in this Eucharistic moment and it is also a triple Amen. Notice how in some of the preaching of Jesus in scripture, he begins: "Amen, Amen, I say to you" We use this triple Amen for emphasis and as a reminder of who we are and what we are called to believe.

Next week we will begin to consider the Communion Rite.
