Do Whatever He Tells You! ... Most of us have been to several weddings so our Gospel this week is the kind of story that each of us can enter into. For a moment let's picture ourselves at the wedding feast at Cana. Suddenly we hear a woman's voice speaking and we can't help overhearing as she exclaims "They have no wine." We turn around and to our surprise and embarrassment she is not pointing at the bride and groom but right at each one of us. She studies us, reads our faces, reads our hearts, reads our lives, then remarks to her Son: "They have no more wine, their wine has run out."

As we confront the current events in the world and the struggles in our life and is easy to become discouraged and feel like "the wine has run out."

So, what are we do? When struggling with the challenging circumstances in our lives we can begin by inviting Jesus to the wedding of our lives and by heeding the last words of our Blessed Mother: "Do whatever he tells you!"

This means to not only invite Jesus into our hearts but also to prayerfully discern what he is telling us to do. Do whatever he tells you is the motto of our Christian culture. Jesus took ordinary things and made them gifts and that is the key for each of us - to see life as a gift. To take what is ordinary and make it extraordinary.

Jesus not only changed water into wine, he also transformed his disciples from becoming mere companions to those who believe in him. When we do whatever he tells us our lives will never be the same. We can look at the people around us and those in our lives and we see many have no more wine. Each of us is called to do something! To pray, to invite, to bear witness, to do whatever he tells us.

Once again let's go back to the wedding at Cana. We are confronted by this remarkable woman who, standing beside her son looks at us and remarks: "They have no wine." Acknowledging the truths of our lives, we must listen and we must act as Jesus is there to change the drab water in our lives into the wine of his love. He is there to touch our ordinary lives and make them radiant. But there's one catch. It is up to us to invite him to the wedding feast of our lives. That invitation is now in our hands to "Do whatever he tells you."
