Staying True to Jesus!

This week as we meditate on the events surrounding the Passion of our Lord, one of the most stunning scenes is Peter in the courtyard.

Peter, warming himself by the fire and concerned for his own safety denied Jesus and, swore falsely to capture a moment of warmth and acceptance from the world while fracturing his relationship with the Lord. When he realized what he had thrown away, how he turned against his Friend, he had nothing left to do but to be blinded by his tears never to forget this moment of shame.

Today we live in a world that often makes us squeamish about our commitment to Jesus Christ. Many are eager for the world's approval and often they buy it even at the price of denying that they know our Friend, Jesus the Christ.

We must never forget how much our relationship and communion with Jesus changes us and identifies us. Peter learned this the hard way – he did not deny a doctrine, rather he hurt a relationship.

Jesus reminds us that as his disciples, as Christians we are called to be outstanding in those controversial, inconvenient situations in the world that cause us to call our whole commitment to Christ in doubt.

As we enter this most holy and sacred time of the year, let us take time to examine our relationship with Jesus, and vow never to deny it like Peter did.

Let's focus on being grateful for the gift of faith by which our lives are immeasurably blessed and resolve to always demonstrate our faith by following the teachings of Jesus in all areas of our lives. Let's treat people the way we would want to be treated and share our faith with others so we too are faithful witnesses to the teachings of our Lord.
