

The Spirit of the Law!....Thinking about "law" as a topic often makes us uneasy. None of us ever want a "run in" with the law and for the most part we are careful to obey laws in our society. In today's Gospel the Pharisees were focused on studying the law and following it to the letter, with the idea that it was the ultimate way of holiness. Imagine reading the Ten Commandments where, when reflecting upon the fifth commandment, "Thou shall not kill," we free ourselves from any responsibility since we have not killed anyone. That would be an example of "letter" of the law. This practice can lead to an empty legalism, devoid of love. Jesus teaches his disciples a correction in attitude in order to escape these pitfalls by using the commandment, "You shall not kill", as an example of the high bar, not the low bar, in how we relate to one another. Now what if, in the Spirit of the law, this commandment was understood in a broader context. I am not guilty of killing anyone, however I may be guilty of "killing" my neighbor's reputation by gossiping about him or her. The Spirit of the law provides for an expanded understanding and gets to the root of Jesus' directive: All relationship-damaging behaviors and things that draw the life out of another, not just the grave sin of murder, are abhorrent. Jesus calls us to lead lives of integrity where we follow not only the letter of the law but, more important, its spirit. Living only by the letter of the law, we may become very rigid and hardened to the sins of ourselves or our neighbor, but when we look at the Spirit, it opens us up to see that the Spirit of love gives life to all.

By following the example Jesus gives us of living the law we will be drawn closer to understanding God's love for us, leading us to become more loving to others.

This week's Spiritual Exercise: Spend some time reflecting on Jesus' words regarding the law. Where do we need to allow Jesus to transform our behavior with respect to the law?
