FROM THE DESK OF DEACON JERRY

Resuming Sunday Masses – Help Needed ... We are still considering resuming the 11:00 am Sunday Mass sometime in August. In order for this to happen we need volunteers to help maintain the protocols specified by the Bishop for resuming Sunday masses. This would entail monitoring the doors and assisting people with any questions when they arrive, helping people find seats while maintaining social distance, and wiping down the used pews and high-touch surfaces after Mass. Scarcity vs. Abundance ... Think for a moment how we view the world. Do we generally see it as a place where people are rude and selfish? Or, do we believe that people are generous, kind, and warm? Do we have a scarcity mentality or an abundance mentality? A **scarcity mentality** is the belief that there will never be enough, resulting in feelings of fear, stress, and anxiety. On the other hand, an **abundance mentality** flows out of a deep inner sense of personal worth and security. It's grounded in the belief that there is more than enough for everyone. Fear of the unknown can cause us to think with a scarcity mentality. Just a couple of months ago we were scrambling for the last roll of toilet paper, the last bottle of hand sanitizer, the last box of pasta or can of soup. Forget about finding Clorox wipes! In our Gospel the disciples are fearing the unknown and are concerned about going hungry. They protest that "five loaves and two fish are all we have" and suggest that Jesus dismiss the crowds as this small amount of food would hardly be enough to feed them alone. If they share it, they will have nothing. They are operating with a scarcity mentality. But Jesus assures them if they share there will be enough for all. He blesses and dis-tributes the meager feast and once everyone has eaten their fill, there is an abundance of leftovers - "twelve wicker baskets full." This Gospel challenges us to trust in God's abundant generosity, and to share what we have so others may have what they need. How might that look in our daily lives? How can we make God's love manifest today? What can we do better? In practical terms, it could mean that we ask for God's help in providing hospitality to others when they need it, and look for the many places in which God's provisions for us are visible. Or, as the twelve disciples handed out food to the 5,000, we might pray for the grace to offer help to others in the face of daunting circumstances. The possibilities are endless. We can always have more of what we want, especially in the form of God's love and abundant grace, when we help others get more of what they need. There is always enough for everyone. How will we adopt an abundance mentality?
